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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the continuation and functions of the Teacher 3 Retirement System of Texas. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 824.002(c), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 (c) For the purposes of this section, a member's employment 7 in a position covered by the retirement system does not end if the 8 member is on leave of absence or has a contract for future 9 employment in a public school, other than a contract for employment 10 11 that would, if the retiring member and the employer were to comply 12 with all procedural requirements, qualify under Section 824.602 for an exception to <u>a reduction or</u> [the] loss of monthly benefits 13 14 required by Section 824.601. SECTION 2. Section 824.2031(b), Government Code, is amended 15 to read as follows: 16 (b) A determination under this section shall be founded on 17 18 the information in the most recent report of an investment practices and performance evaluation [audit] conducted under 19 Section 802.109 [825.512] and the application of that information 20 21 to: 22 (1) the present amortization period for liabilities of 23 the retirement system; 24 (2) the rate of return on retirement system 87R2484 BDP-D 1

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1 investments over and above the rate of inflation of the investment
2 portfolio as a whole, of the portion of the investment portfolio
3 entrusted to private investment entities, and of the portion of the
4 investment portfolio entrusted to investment officers who are
5 employees of the retirement system;

6 (3) economic projections of market conditions and 7 future investment rates of return as reflected in the comptroller's 8 most recent economic forecast and revenue estimate;

9 (4) the costs, including changes in the amortization 10 period for liabilities of the retirement system, of providing 11 cost-of-living or other increases in benefits to current 12 annuitants; and

13 (5) an evaluation of the diversity of retirement 14 system investments and whether the portfolio provides low-risk, 15 long-term growth.

SECTION 3. The heading to Subchapter G, Chapter 824, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

18 SUBCHAPTER G. <u>REDUCTION OR</u> LOSS OF BENEFITS ON RESUMPTION OF

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SERVICE

20 SECTION 4. The heading to Section 824.601, Government Code, 21 is amended to read as follows:

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Sec. 824.601. <u>REDUCTION OR</u> LOSS OF MONTHLY BENEFITS.

23 SECTION 5. Section 824.601, Government Code, is amended by 24 amending Subsections (b) and (e) and adding Subsections (b-3) and 25 (b-4) to read as follows:

(b) Except as provided by Subsection (b-1), (b-3), or (b-4),
or Section 824.602 and subject to Subsection (b-2), during [<del>a</del>

No. 1585 retiree is not entitled to service or disability retirement benefit 1 payments, as applicable, for] any month in which a [the] retiree is 2 3 employed in any position by a Texas public educational institution, 4 the retiree's entitlement to service or disability retirement 5 benefit payments for that month is reduced by an amount equal to the 6 lesser of: 7 (1) the retiree's benefit payment for that month; or (2) the total compensation earned by the retiree for 8 the employment during that month: 9 10 (A) as reported by the retiree's employer; or 11 (B) if not reported, verified in a manner prescribed by the retirement system. 12 (b-3) If the total compensation earned by a retiree is not 13 reported or verified under Subsection (b)(2), the retiree's 14 15 entitlement to service or disability retirement benefit payments for that month is reduced by an amount equal to the retiree's 16 17 benefit payment for that month. (b-4) A retiree under Section 824.302 who is employed in any 18 19 position by a Texas public educational institution for more than 90 days in a school year is not entitled to disability retirement 20 benefit payments for the months the retiree was employed by the 21 22 institution unless the retiree qualifies for the exception 23 described by Section 824.602(g). 24 A reduction or loss [Loss] of benefits under this (e) section does not extend any period of guaranteed benefits elected 25 pursuant to Section 824.204. 26

SECTION 6. Sections 824.602(a), (g), and (k), Government

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1 Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) Subject to Section 825.506, the retirement system may
not, under Section 824.601, <u>reduce or</u> withhold a monthly benefit
payment if the retiree is employed in a Texas public educational
institution:

6 (1) as a substitute only with pay not more than the 7 daily rate of substitute pay established by the employer and, if the 8 retiree is a disability retiree, the employment has not exceeded a 9 total of 90 days in the school year;

10 (2) in a position, other than as a substitute, on no
11 more than a one-half time basis for the month;

12 (3) in one or more positions on as much as a full-time 13 basis, if the retiree has been separated from service with all Texas 14 public educational institutions for at least 12 full consecutive 15 months after the retiree's effective date of retirement; or

16 (4) in a position, other than as a substitute, on no 17 more than a one-half time basis for no more than 90 days in the 18 school year, if the retiree is a disability retiree.

(g) The exceptions provided by Subsections (a)(2) and (a)(3) do not apply to disability retirees. The retirement system nevertheless may not withhold a monthly benefit payment under Section 824.601 if:

(1) a disability retiree is employed in a Texas public
educational institution in a position, other than as a substitute,
for a period not to exceed three consecutive months;

(2) the work occurs in a period, designated by the
disability retiree, of no more than three consecutive months;

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(3) the disability retiree executes on a form and at a time prescribed by the retirement system a written election to have 2 3 this exception apply on a one-time trial basis in determining whether benefits are to be suspended for the months of employment 4 5 after retirement and in determining whether a disability retiree is no longer mentally or physically incapacitated for the performance 6 of duty; and 7

8 (4) the disability retiree has not previously elected to avoid a reduction or loss of monthly benefits under this 9 subsection. 10

(k) The actuary designated by the board of trustees shall, 11 in investigating the experience of the members of the system, note 12 any significant increase in early age retirements and determine the 13 14 extent to which any increase has been caused by the exception to a 15 reduction or loss of benefits for employment after retirement provided by Subsection (a)(3). If the actuary certifies in writing 16 17 to the retirement system that sound actuarial funding of the retirement system's benefits is endangered by continuation of this 18 19 exception, the board of trustees may determine that no further elections of the exception will be accepted from retirees, other 20 21 than from those who have previously relied on the exception in retiring under this subtitle. A retiree may be considered to have 22 23 relied on this exception only if retirement occurred on or after May 24 31, 1985, but before the date the board of trustees acknowledges receipt of such certification and if the retiree has first elected 25 26 to receive benefits under the exception not later than two years after the retiree's effective date of retirement. 27

1 SECTION 7. Section 824.601(f), Government Code, is 2 redesignated as Section 824.604, Government Code, and amended to 3 read as follows:

<u>Sec. 824.604. RULES.</u> [(f)] The board of trustees [system]
may adopt rules necessary for administering this subchapter.

6 SECTION 8. Section 825.0041, Government Code, is amended by 7 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d) to read as 8 follows:

9 (b) <u>The</u> [A] training program must provide the person with
10 information regarding:

11 (1) the <u>law governing</u> [<del>legislation that created the</del>] 12 retirement system <u>operations;</u> [<del>and the system's</del>]

13 (2) the programs, functions, rules, and budget of the 14 system;

15 (3) the scope of and limitations on the rulemaking 16 <u>authority of the board of trustees;</u>

17 <u>(4)</u> [<del>(2)</del>] the results of the most recent formal audit 18 of the system;

19 (5) [(3) the requirements of:

20 <u>(A)</u> laws relating to open meetings, public 21 information, administrative procedure, and <u>disclosing</u> 22 <u>conflicts-of-interest</u> [<del>conflicts of interest</del>]; <u>and</u>

(B) other laws applicable to members of a state
 policy-making body in performing their duties; and

25 (6) [(4)] any applicable ethics policies adopted by
 26 the system or the Texas Ethics Commission.

27 (d) The executive director of the retirement system shall

1 create a training manual that includes the information required by
2 Subsection (b). The executive director shall distribute a copy of
3 the training manual annually to each member of the board of
4 trustees. Each member of the board of trustees shall sign and
5 submit to the executive director a statement acknowledging that the
6 member received and has reviewed the training manual.

7 SECTION 9. Section 825.006, Government Code, is amended to 8 read as follows:

9 Sec. 825.006. SUNSET PROVISION. The board of trustees of 10 the Teacher Retirement System of Texas is subject to review under 11 Chapter 325 (Texas Sunset Act), but is not abolished under that 12 chapter. The board shall be reviewed during the period in which 13 state agencies abolished in <u>2033</u> [<del>2021</del>], and every 12th year after 14 that year, are reviewed.

SECTION 10. Subchapter C, Chapter 825, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 825.216 to read as follows:

Sec. 825.216. OMBUDSMAN. (a) Subject to Section 825.506, the board of trustees shall designate an ombudsman within the retirement system to assist members by performing member protection and advocacy functions, including: (1) monitoring the system's interactions with members;

22 (2) receiving and reviewing complaints from members;

23 (3) taking appropriate action regarding complaints, 24 including conducting investigations of complaints or escalating or 25 reporting complaints to the board;

26 (4) informing a member and the board of the results of 27 the ombudsman's review or investigation of a member's complaint;

2	(5) recommending corrective actions to the board as
3	determined necessary by the ombudsman to resolve complaints.
4	(b) The ombudsman designated under this section shall
5	regularly submit a report to the board of trustees recommending
6	changes to the retirement system's operations that would benefit
7	members and increase opportunities for the members to participate
8	in the system's decisions.
9	SECTION 11. Section 825.308, Government Code, is amended to
10	read as follows:
11	Sec. 825.308. STATE CONTRIBUTION ACCOUNT. The retirement
12	system shall deposit in the state contribution account:
13	(1) all state contributions to the retirement system
14	required by Section 825.404;
15	(2) amounts from the interest account as provided by
16	Section 825.313(b)(2);
17	(3) retirement annuities <u>, or that portion of</u>
18	annuities, as applicable, waived or forfeited in accordance with
19	Section 824.601 or 824.004;
20	(4) fees collected under Section 825.403(h);
21	(5) fees and interest for reinstatement of service
22	credit or establishment of membership service credit as provided by
23	Section 823.501;
24	(6) the portion of a deposit required by Section
25	823.302 to establish military service credit that represents a fee;
26	and
27	(7) employer contributions required under Section

1 825.4092.

2 SECTION 12. Section 825.4041(f), Government Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

4 (f) At the end of each school year, the retirement system
5 shall certify to the [commissioner of education and to the] state
6 auditor:

7 (1) the name of each employer that <u>is an institution of</u> 8 <u>higher education and</u> has failed to remit, within the period 9 required by Section 825.408, all payments required under this 10 section for the school year; and

11 (2) the amounts of the unpaid required payments.

SECTION 13. Section 825.405(f), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

14 (f) If the commissioner of education receives а 15 certification from the retirement system regarding unpaid contributions [under Subsection (e)], the commissioner shall 16 17 direct the comptroller of public accounts to withhold the amount certified, plus interest computed at the rate and in the manner 18 provided by Section 825.408, from the first state money payable to 19 the employer. The amount withheld shall be deposited to the credit 20 of the appropriate accounts of the retirement system. 21

SECTION 14. Section 825.502, Government Code, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:

(b) If the member or the member's heirs cannot be found after complying with the policy adopted under Subsection (c), the member's accumulated contributions are forfeited to the retirement

system. The retirement system shall credit the amount forfeited to
 the retired reserve account.

3 (c) The board of trustees shall adopt a policy requiring the 4 retirement system to make all reasonable efforts to locate and 5 notify a member or, if appropriate, the member's heirs of their 6 entitlement to a return of accumulated contributions under this 7 section. The policy must ensure that the:

8 <u>(1) notice:</u>

9 (A) provides information on how a member or the 10 member's heirs, as appropriate, may withdraw the accumulated 11 contributions, including information on how to effectuate a 12 withdrawal through an election to receive a direct rollover of the 13 contributions to an eligible retirement plan; and 14 (B) is initially sent to the member by certified 15 mail, return receipt requested, at the last known address of the

16 member according to the system's records; and

17 (2) procedure used to locate a member or the member's
18 heirs:

(A) requires, at a minimum, that the system 19 conduct Internet searches to determine a current and accurate 20 21 mailing address of the member or the member's heir and send a notice 22 that complies with Subdivision (1) to the member or the member's heir, as applicable, by certified mail, return receipt requested; 23 24 and 25 (B) employs a matrix based on defined factors for 26 determining on a graduated scale the degree and type of additional

27 effort required, and those efforts must include:

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1	(i) contacting the member's designated
2	<pre>beneficiary;</pre>
3	(ii) obtaining information from consumer
4	reporting agencies; and
5	(iii) using commercial locating services.
6	SECTION 15. Sections 825.511(a) and (c), Government Code,
7	are amended to read as follows:
8	(a) The retirement system shall maintain a system to
9	promptly and efficiently act on complaints filed with the
10	retirement system [that the system has authority to resolve]. The
11	retirement system shall maintain information about parties to the
12	complaint, the subject matter of the complaint, a summary of the
13	results of the review or investigation of the complaint, and its
14	disposition.
15	(c) The retirement system shall periodically notify the
16	complaint parties of the status of the complaint until final
17	disposition unless the notice would jeopardize an investigation.
18	SECTION 16. Section 825.521, Government Code, is amended to
19	read as follows:
20	Sec. 825.521. DEADLINE TO APPEAL [ <del>FINAL</del> ] ADMINISTRATIVE
21	DECISION. In adopting rules governing <u>an</u> [ <del>the</del> ] appeal <u>authorized</u>
22	by law or rule of a determination or decision of the retirement
23	system by the system's staff, including a final administrative
24	decision of the [retirement] system, the board of trustees shall
25	ensure that rules establishing deadlines for $[the]$ filing <u>the</u> $[of$
26	an] appeal afford a member or retiree at least the same amount of
27	time to file <u>the</u> [ <del>an</del> ] appeal as the retirement system has to issue

the <u>determination or</u> [retirement system's] decision. 1 2 SECTION 17. The heading to Subchapter G, Chapter 825, 3 Government Code, is amended to read as follows: SUBCHAPTER G. 4	does not provide financial or legal advice <u>;</u>
5	(4) provide at least annually to each member of the

8	(5) enhance employer training and establish an
9	Internet portal designed to assist employers to:
10	(A) satisfy applicable reporting requirements;
11	(B) provide general information to individual
12	members on:
13	(i) employment after retirement;
14	(ii) enrollment in health insurance
15	benefit plans; and
16	(iii) retirement benefits and retirement
17	planning; and
18	(C) facilitate other communications or exchanges
19	involving members and the retirement system; and
20	(6) design and implement methods for maintaining
21	up-to-date contact information for members and beneficiaries based
22	on best practices for outreach.
23	(b) In developing the outreach plan, the board of trustees
24	shall solicit input through surveys or other means from members of
25	the system, employers, and other stakeholders, including
26	appropriate advisory groups.
27	(c) Once every five years, the retirement system shall

STUDY AND REPORT BY TRUSTEE. 25 (a) The 26 trustee shall study the operation and administration of this 27 chapter, including:

1 (c) Every <u>12</u> [six] months the trustee shall submit to the 2 comptroller and the Legislative Budget Board a report regarding any 3 cost savings achieved in the program through implementation of the 4 prior authorization requirement of this section. The report must 5 cover the previous <u>12-month</u> [six-month] period.

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(d) In the report under Subsection (c), the trustee:

7 (1) may include any cost savings achieved in the 8 program for coverage of prescribed drugs that are not included in 9 the categories listed in Subsection (b) for which prior 10 authorization is required by a health coverage plan provided under 11 this chapter; and

12 (2) considering cost and medical necessity, shall 13 identify any categories of prescribed drugs in addition to the 14 categories listed in Subsection (b) for which requiring prior 15 authorization could achieve cost savings.

The following provisions are repealed:

SECTION 24.

19 (3) Section 825.512, Government Code; and

20 (4) Section 1575.452, Insurance Code.

SECTION 25. Sections 824.601 and 824.602, Government Code, as amended by this Act, apply only to a benefit payment made by the Teacher Retirement System of Texas that becomes payable on or after the effective date of this Act.

25 SECTION 26. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of 26 this section, Section 825.0041, Government Code, as amended by this 27 Act, applies to a member of the board of trustees of the Teacher

Retirement System of Texas appointed before, on, or after the
 effective date of this Act.

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(b) A member of the board of trustees of the Teacher 3 Retirement System of Texas who, before the effective date of this 4 5 Act, completed the training program required by Section 825.0041, Government Code, as that law existed before the effective date of 6 this Act, is only required to complete additional training on the 7 8 subjects added by this Act to the training program required by Section 825.0041, Government Code. A board member described by 9 10 this subsection may not vote, deliberate, or be counted as a member in attendance at a meeting of the board held on or after December 1, 11 2021, until the member completes the additional training. 12

13 SECTION 27. As soon as practicable after the effective date 14 of this Act, but not later than December 1, 2021, the Teacher 15 Retirement System of Texas shall implement the outreach plan 16 required by Section 825.601, Government Code, as amended by this 17 Act.

18 SECTION 28. This Act takes effect immediately if it 19 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 20 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 21 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate 22 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
