2	relating to personhood rights for born and preborn human beings.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Title 1, Health and Safety Code, is amended by
5	adding Chapter 2 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 2. PERSONHOOD RIGHTS
7	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
8	Sec. 2.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Assisted reproduction" has the meaning assigned
10	by Section 160.102, Family Code.
11	(2) "Human embryo" means a genetically complete living
12	organism of the species Homo sapiens, from the single-cell
13	fertilized egg to the blastocyst stage.
14	Sec. 2.002. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS. Regarding the sanctity
15	of life, the legislature finds:
16	(1) the July 4, 1776, Declaration of Independence is
17	one of the organic laws of the United States;
18	(2) all persons are endowed by their Creator with
19	certain unalienable rights;
20	(3) personhood is God-given, as all persons are
21	created in the image of God; and
22	(4) a human being is a person at fertilization.
23	Sec. 2.003. CONSTRUCTION OF CHAPTER. This chapter may not
24	be construed to prohibit:

- 1 (1) a licensed physician from performing a medical
- 2 procedure or providing medical treatment designed or intended to
- 3 prevent the death of a pregnant woman in accordance with Section
- 4 2.052;
- 5 (2) contraception to prevent fertilization; or
- 6 (3) in vitro fertilization or other assisted
- 7 reproduction.
- 8 Sec. 2.004. CONFLICT OF LAWS. This chapter prevails over
- 9 other law to the extent of any conflict.
- 10 <u>SUBCHAPTER B. PERSONHOOD RIGHTS</u>
- Sec. 2.051. VESTMENT OF RIGHTS. (a) The right to life for
- 12 each born and preborn human being vests at fertilization.
- 13 (b) Due process rights guaranteed by the laws of this state
- 14 for each born and preborn human being vest at fertilization.
- 15 Sec. 2.052. MEDICAL TREATMENT ON PREGNANT WOMEN TO PREVENT
- 16 DEATH; ENFORCEMENT. (a) While providing to a pregnant woman
- 17 treatment designed or intended to prevent the death of the woman, a
- 18 physician shall make reasonable medical efforts under the
- 19 circumstances to preserve the life of both the woman and the preborn
- 20 human being in a manner consistent with accepted medical standards.
- 21 (b) An accidental or unintentional injury or death to a
- 22 preborn human being does not violate this chapter.
- (c) The threat of a pregnant woman's death may not be based
- 24 on:
- 25 (1) a diagnosis or claim of a mental or emotional
- 26 condition of the woman; or
- 27 (2) a diagnosis or claim that the woman will

- 1 purposefully engage in conduct that she intends will result in her
- 2 death.
- 3 (d) This section may not be construed to authorize the
- 4 intentional killing of a preborn human being.
- 5 (e) The Texas Medical Board may take a disciplinary action
- 6 authorized under Subtitle B, Title 3, Occupations Code, against a
- 7 physician who violates this chapter as if the physician violated
- 8 Subtitle B, Title 3, Occupations Code.
- 9 Sec. 2.053. EMBRYO DISPUTE STANDARDS. In a dispute between
- 10 any persons regarding an unimplanted human embryo created using
- 11 assisted reproduction, the court shall resolve the dispute in
- 12 accordance with the best interests of the embryo.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 2.053, Health and Safety Code, as added
- 14 by this Act, applies only to a cause of action that accrues on or
- 15 after the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
