## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT relating to the methods of voter registration. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 13, Election Code, is amended by adding Sections 13.009 and 13.010 to read as follows: <u>Sec. 13.009. AUTOMATIC VOTER REGISTRATION THROUGH</u> DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY FOR CERTAIN PERSONS. (a) The voter registrar of each county shall automatically register any county resident who is 18 years of age, eligible to vote as provided by Section 13.001, and issued a Texas driver's license or a personal

11 <u>identification card by the Department of Public Safety unless the</u> 12 <u>resident chooses not to be registered.</u> 13 <u>(b) A driver's license or personal identification card</u>

14 transaction with an indication provided by Section 20.063(c) that 15 the transaction is not for voter registration purposes is not 16 subject to this section.

17 <u>Sec. 13.010. ELECTRONIC VOTER REGISTRATION. (a) The</u> 18 <u>secretary of state shall implement a program to allow a person to</u> 19 <u>complete a voter registration application over the Internet from</u> 20 <u>the official Internet website of this state. The Internet websites</u> 21 <u>of the secretary of state and the Department of Public Safety must</u> 22 <u>also provide a link to the location of the application on the</u> 23 <u>official Internet website of this state.</u>

24 (b) An applicant for electronic voter registration who has

No. 1630 an unexpired driver's license or personal identification card 1 2 issued in this state must: 3 (1) attest to the truth of the information provided on the application by affirmatively accepting the information as true; 4 5 and 6 (2) affirmatively consent to the use of the signature 7 on the applicant's driver's license or personal identification card 8 for voter registration purposes. (c) An applicant for electronic voter registration who does 9 not have an unexpired driver's license or personal identification 10 card issued in this state must: 11 12 (1) attest to the truth of the information provided on the application by affirmatively accepting the information as true; 13 14 and 15 (2) print a registration application from the Internet website the applicant is using to register, sign the application, 16 17 and mail it to the registrar. (d) For each application submitted under Subsection (b), 18 19 the program shall require that a digital copy of the applicant's signature be obtained from the Department of Public Safety. 20 21 (e) For each application submitted under Subsection (c), the program shall provide the applicant with: 22 23 (1) a registration application that the applicant can 24 print from the registration website, sign, and mail to the registrar as required under Subsection (c)(2); and 25 26 (2) information about how the applicant can obtain a driver's license or personal identification card from 27 the

2	(f) An application submitted under this section is
3	considered for all purposes an application submitted by mail under
4	this title.
5	(g) The secretary of state shall adopt rules as necessary to
6	implement this section, including rules to provide for additional
7	security measures necessary to ensure the accuracy and integrity of
8	applications submitted electronically.
9	(h) The rules adopted under Subsection (g) must require
10	that:
11	(1) the Internet website through which a person may
12	complete a voter registration application include a description of
13	the offense described by Section 13.007 in a conspicuous location
14	on the website near the place where the person begins or submits the
15	application; and
16	(2) the state electronic Internet portal project be
17	used to authenticate the identity of a person who submits an
18	application electronically under this section.
19	SECTION 2. Section 20.061, Election Code, is amended to
20	read as follows:
21	Sec. 20.061. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER PROVISIONS. The other
22	provisions of this chapter apply to the Department of Public Safety
23	except provisions that conflict with this subchapter or Section
24	<u>13.009</u> .
25	SECTION 3. Section 20.063, Election Code, is amended by
26	amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (e) to read
27	as follows:

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(a) The Department of Public Safety shall provide to each
person who applies in person, by mail, or online at the department's
<u>Internet website</u> [at the department's offices] for an original or
renewal of a driver's license, a personal identification card, or a
duplicate or corrected license or card an opportunity to complete a
voter registration application form.

7 A change of address that relates to a license or card and (c) 8 that is submitted to the department in person, [or] by mail, or online at the department's Internet website serves as a change of 9 address for voter registration unless the licensee or cardholder 10 indicates that the change is not for voter registration purposes. 11 The date of submission of a change of address to a department 12 employee is considered to be the date of submission to the voter 13 14 registrar for the purpose of determining the effective date of 15 registration [only].

16 (e) The Department of Public Safety shall consider an 17 application made in person, by mail, or online at the department's Internet website for an original or renewal of a driver's license, a 18 19 personal identification card, or a duplicate or corrected license or card by a person who is 18 years of age and eligible to vote as 20 provided by Section 13.001 an application for voter registration. 21 The date of application is considered to be the date of submission 22 23 to the voter registrar for the purpose of determining the effective 24 date of registration. The registration of an eligible voter under this subsection is automatic unless the person indicates that the 25 26 person is choosing not to be registered or that the transaction is not for voter registration purposes. 27

H.B. No. 1630 1 SECTION 4. Section 20.065(b), Election Code, is amended to 2 read as follows: 3 (b) Each weekday the department is regularly open for

4 business, the department shall electronically transfer to the 5 secretary of state the name <u>and information designated by the</u> 6 <u>secretary of state for</u> [<del>of</del>] each person who completes a voter 7 registration application submitted to the department <u>and for each</u> 8 <u>individual who is eligible for registration under Section</u> 9 <u>20.063(e)</u>. The secretary shall prescribe procedures necessary to 10 implement this subsection.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
