(a) In this 6 section, "body worn camera" has the meaning assigned by Section 7 1701.651, Occupations Code. 8 (b) The department shall adopt a policy for the use of body 9 worn cameras by correctional officers at facilities operated by or 10 under contract with the department. The policy must require that 11 each correctional officer be equipped with a body worn camera 12 during the officer's shift and require each officer to keep the 13 14 camera activated during the performance of the officer's duties. SECTION 2. Section 511.009, Government Code, is amended by 15 16 adding Subsection (f) to read as follows: (f) The commission shall require the sheriff of each county 17 to adopt a policy for the use of body worn cameras by correctional 18 officers at each county jail within the sheriff's jurisdiction. A 19 policy adopted under this subsection must require that each 20 correctional officer be equipped with a body worn camera during the 21 officer's shift and require each officer to keep the camera 22 23 activated during the performance of the officer's duties. For purposes of this subsection, "body worn camera" has the meaning 24

2 SECTION 3. (a) The Texas Department of Criminal Justice 3 shall adopt the policy required by Section 493.034, Government 4 Code, as added by this Act, not later than January 1, 2022.

5 (b) The Commission on Jail Standards shall require the 6 sheriff of each county to adopt the policy required by Section 7 511.009(f), Government Code, as added by this Act, not later than 8 January 1, 2022.
