4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 231, Local Government Code, is amended
6	by adding Subchapter N to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER N. ZONING AROUND THE BRAZOS RIVER IN FORT BEND COUNTY
8	Sec. 231.301. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS; PURPOSE. (a) The
9	<pre>legislature finds that:</pre>
10	(1) the area that surrounds the Brazos River in Fort
11	Bend County:
12	(A) is frequented for recreational purposes by
13	residents from every part of the state; and
14	(B) is critical for the bays and estuaries in the
15	Gulf of Mexico;
16	(2) orderly development and use of the area is of
17	concern to the entire state; and
18	(3) buildings in the area that are frequented for
19	resort or recreational purposes tend to become congested and tend
20	to be used in ways that interfere with the proper use of the area as
21	a place of recreation to the detriment of the public health, safety,

morals, and general welfare.

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(b) The powers granted under this subchapter are for the

- 1 (1) promoting the public health, safety, peace,
- 2 morals, and general welfare;
- 3 (2) encouraging tourism and recreation; and
- 4 (3) safeguarding and preventing the pollution of the
- 5 state's water resources.
- 6 Sec. 231.302. AREAS SUBJECT TO REGULATION. This subchapter
- 7 applies only to the unincorporated areas of Fort Bend County within
- 8 500 feet of the Brazos River.
- 9 Sec. 231.303. DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS GENERALLY. The
- 10 <u>commissioners court of Fort Bend County may regulate:</u>
- 11 (1) the percentage of a lot that may be occupied or
- 12 developed;
- 13 (2) population density;
- 14 (3) the size and location of buildings; and
- 15 (4) the location, design, construction, extension,
- 16 and size of streets and roads.
- 17 Sec. 231.304. RELATIONSHIP TO COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL PLANS.
- 18 Development regulations must be:
- 19 (1) adopted in accordance with a county plan for
- 20 growth and development of the county; and
- 21 (2) coordinated with the comprehensive plans of
- 22 municipalities located in the county.
- Sec. 231.305. DISTRICTS. (a) The commissioners court may
- 24 divide the unincorporated area of the county into districts of a
- 25 number, shape, and size the court considers best for carrying out
- 26 this subchapter.
- 27 (b) Development regulations may vary from district to

- 1 <u>district.</u>
- 2 Sec. 231.306. PROCEDURE GOVERNING ADOPTION OF REGULATIONS
- 3 AND DISTRICT BOUNDARIES. (a) A development regulation adopted
- 4 under this subchapter is not effective until it is adopted by the
- 5 commissioners court after a public hearing. Before the 15th day
- 6 before the date of the hearing, the commissioners court must
- 7 publish notice of the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation
- 8 in the county.
- 9 (b) The commissioners court may establish or amend a
- 10 development regulation only by an order passed by a majority vote of
- 11 the full membership of the court.
- 12 Sec. 231.307. DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION. (a) The
- 13 commissioners court may appoint a development commission to assist
- 14 in the implementation and enforcement of development regulations
- 15 <u>adopted under this subchapter.</u>
- 16 (b) The development commission must consist of an ex officio
- 17 chair who must be a public official in Fort Bend County and four
- 18 additional members.
- 19 (c) The development commission is advisory only and may
- 20 recommend appropriate development regulations for the county.
- 21 <u>(d)</u> The members of the development commission are subject to
- 22 the same requirements relating to conflicts of interest that are
- 23 applicable to the commissioners court under Chapter 171.
- Sec. 231.308. SPECIAL EXCEPTION. (a) A person aggrieved by
- 25 a regulation adopted under this subchapter may petition the
- 26 commissioners court for a special exception to the regulation.
- 27 (b) The commissioners court may grant a special exception to

- 1 the regulation if the person who petitioned under Subsection (a)
- 2 demonstrates that the requested exception adequately protects the
- 3 public health, safety, or general welfare.
- 4 (c) The commissioners court shall adopt procedures
- 5 governing applications, notice, hearings, and other matters
- 6 relating to the grant of a special exception.
- 7 Sec. 231.309. ENFORCEMENT; CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) The
- 8 commissioners court may adopt orders to enforce this subchapter or
- 9 an order or regulation adopted under this subchapter.
- 10 (b) A person commits an offense if the person violates an
- 11 order or regulation adopted under this subchapter. An offense
- 12 under this subsection is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not
- 13 less than \$500 or more than \$1,000. Each day that a violation
- 14 occurs constitutes a separate offense.
- 15 Sec. 231.310. COOPERATION WITH MUNICIPALITIES. The
- 16 commissioners court by order may enter into agreements with any
- 17 municipality located in the county to assist in the implementation
- 18 and enforcement of development regulations adopted under this
- 19 subchapter.
- Sec. 231.311. CONFLICT WITH OTHER LAWS. If a development
- 21 regulation adopted under this subchapter imposes higher standards
- 22 than those required under another statute or local order or
- 23 regulation, the regulation adopted under this subchapter controls.
- 24 If the other statute or local order or regulation imposes higher
- 25 standards, that statute, order, or regulation controls.
- 26 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
