AN ACT

- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 11, Education Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 11.172 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 11.172. POSTING OF FOUNDING DOCUMENTS. The board of
- 10 trustees of an independent school district shall permit and
- 11 encourage the posting in a district classroom or school building of
- 12 <u>a copy of the founding documents of the United States, including the</u>
- 13 Declaration of Independence, the United States Constitution, the
- 14 Federalist Papers, and the writings of the Founding Fathers of the
- 15 United States.

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- SECTION 2. Section 12.104(b), Education Code, as amended by
- 17 Chapters 262 (H.B. 1597), 464 (S.B. 11), 467 (H.B. 4170), and 943

- 2 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Section 28.0111 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 28.0111. FOUNDING PRINCIPLES ELECTIVE. (a) Each
- 5 school district and open-enrollment charter school that offers a
- 6 high school program shall provide an elective course on the
- 7 <u>founding principles</u> of the United States that meets the
- 8 requirements for a one-half elective credit under Section 28.025.
- 9 (b) The course must focus on the principles underlying the
- 10 United States form of government, the Declaration of Independence,
- 11 the United States Constitution, the Federalist Papers, and the
- 12 writings of the Founding Fathers of the United States.
- 13 SECTION 4. Section 28.0111, Education Code, as added by
- 14 this Act, applies beginning with the 2022-2023 school year.
- 15 SECTION 5. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 16 over another Act of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021,
- 17 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 18 codes.
- 19 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
