5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 37.087 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 37.087. IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Retired peace officer" has the meaning assigned
10	by Section 1701.3161, Occupations Code.
11	(2) "Security personnel" includes:
12	(A) a school district peace officer;
13	(B) a school marshal;
14	(C) a school resource officer; and
15	(D) a retired peace officer who:
16	(i) has been hired by a school district,
17	open-enrollment charter school, or private school to provide
18	security services; or
19	(ii) volunteers to provide security
20	services to the school district, open-enrollment charter school, or
21	<pre>private school.</pre>
22	(b) A school district, open-enrollment charter school, or
23	private school is immune from liability for any damages resulting
2/1	from any reasonable action taken by security personnel to maintain

- 1 the safety of the school campus, including action relating to
- 2 possession or use of a firearm.
- 3 (c) A school district, open-enrollment charter school, or
- 4 private school is immune from liability as provided by Subsection
- 5 (b) for any damages resulting from any reasonable action taken by a
- 6 school district, open-enrollment charter school, or private school
- 7 employee who has written permission from the board of trustees of
- 8 the school district or the governing body of the open-enrollment
- 9 charter school or the private school to carry a firearm on campus.
- 10 (d) Any security personnel employed by a school district,
- 11 open-enrollment charter school, or private school is immune from
- 12 liability for any damages resulting from any reasonable action
- 13 taken by the security personnel to maintain the safety of the school
- 14 campus, including action relating to possession or use of a
- 15 firearm.
- 16 (e) The statutory immunity provided by this section is in
- 17 addition to and does not preempt the common law doctrine of official
- 18 and governmental immunity. To the extent that another statute
- 19 provides greater immunity to a school district, open-enrollment
- 20 charter school, or private school than this section, that statute
- 21 <u>prevails.</u>
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
- 23 school year.
- 24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
