19	[(c)] The board of a district [covered by this section] may
20	order an election to be held in the district to determine whether
21	the district should assume the rights, authority, privileges, and
22	functions of a road district under Article III, Section 52(b)(3),

- 12 (b) $[\frac{d}{d}]$ A district operating as a road district may not issue bonds or otherwise lend its credit for road district purposes 13 except on approval of not less than two-thirds of the qualified 14 15 voters of the district voting at an election called and held for that purpose. The total amount of bonds, notes, and other 16 17 obligations of the district issued or incurred under subsection may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed valuation of 18 19 real property in the district.

- 20 (c) [(e)] A district that has adopted the rights, authority, privileges, and functions of a road district in the 21 manner provided by Subsection (a) [(c)] may, following approval of 22 23 a construction contract by the district's governing body, reimburse expenditures as provided by Sections 257.003(a) 24 Transportation Code, without any additional approval under Section 25 26 257.003, Transportation Code.

- 6 (2) is not levying ad valorem taxes.
