## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to requiring county approval of a proposed purchase or conversion by a municipality of a property to house homeless 3 individuals. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 211.003(a), Local Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 Except as provided by Subchapter C, Chapter 244, the 8 (a) 9 [The] governing body of a municipality may regulate: (1) the height, number of stories, and size 10 of buildings and other structures; 11 12 (2) the percentage of a lot that may be occupied; 13 the size of yards, courts, and other open spaces; (3) 14 (4) population density; location and use of (5) the buildings, 15 other structures, and land for business, industrial, residential, or 16 other purposes; and 17 18 (6) the pumping, extraction, and use of groundwater by persons other than retail public utilities, as defined by Section 19 20 13.002, Water Code, for the purpose of preventing the use or contact 21 with groundwater that presents an actual or potential threat to 22 human health. SECTION 2. Chapter 244, Local Government Code, is amended 23 by adding Subchapter C to read as follows: 24

13	"proposed new residents" means homeless individuals the
14	municipality intends to house at the purchased or converted

16	(b) A plan required by Section 244.041 shall describe:
17	(1) the availability of local health care for proposed
18	new residents, including access to Medicaid services and mental
19	health services;
20	(2) the availability of indigent services for proposed
21	new residents;
22	(3) the availability of reasonably affordable public
23	transportation for proposed new residents;
24	(4) local law enforcement resources in the area of the
25	property; and
26	(5) what steps the municipality has taken to
27	coordinate with the local mental health authority to provide for

1 any proposed new residents. 2 (c) A municipality shall respond to any reasonable requests for additional information made by the commissioners court 3 regarding the proposed property purchase or use conversion. 4 Sec. 244.043. NOTICE. A municipality that intends to 5 purchase or convert a property to house homeless individuals shall: 6 7 (1) post notice of the proposed use of the property at 8 the property not later than the 61st day before the proposed date of purchase or conversion; and 9 10 (2) publish notice of the proposed purchase or

11 conversion of the property for 10 consecutive days in a newspaper of 12 general circulation in the county in which the property is located, 13 with the first day being not later than the 61st day before the 14 proposed date of purchase or conversion.

15 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to a municipal purchase or use conversion described by Subchapter C, 16 17 Chapter 244, Local Government Code, as added by this Act, that is not final on the effective date of this Act. A municipal purchase 18 or use conversion that was final before the effective date of this 19 Act is governed by the law in effect when the municipal purchase or 20 use conversion was completed, and the former law is continued in 21 effect for that purpose. 22

23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
