- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Chapter 2, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 5 amended by adding Article 2.1315 to read as follows:
- Art. 2.1315. MOTORCYCLE PROFILING PROHIBITED. (a) In this
- 7 <u>article:</u>
- 8 (1) "Law enforcement agency" and "motor vehicle stop"
- 9 have the meanings assigned by Article 2.132.
- 10 (2) "Motorcycle profiling" means a law
- 11 enforcement-initiated action based wholly or partly on an
- 12 <u>individual operating a motorcycle or wearing motorcycle-related or</u>
- 13 motorcycle club-related paraphernalia rather than on the
- 14 individual's behavior or on information identifying the individual
- 15 as having engaged in criminal activity. The term includes a motor
- 16 vehicle stop that is made with respect to an individual operating a
- 17 motorcycle and that the peace officer extends beyond the period
- 18 necessary to effectuate the purpose of the stop.
- 19 (b) A peace officer may not engage in motorcycle profiling.
- 20 <u>(c) Each law enforcement agency in this state shall adopt a</u>
- 21 detailed written policy on motorcycle profiling. The policy must:
- 22 <u>(1) clearly define acts constituting motorcycle</u>
- 23 profiling;
- 24 (2) strictly prohibit peace officers employed by the

- 1 agency from engaging in motorcycle profiling;
- 2 (3) implement a process by which an individual may
- 3 file a complaint with the agency if the individual believes that a
- 4 peace officer employed by the agency has engaged in motorcycle
- 5 profiling with respect to the individual; and
- 6 (4) require appropriate disciplinary action to be
- 7 taken against a peace officer employed by the agency who, after an
- 8 investigation, is shown to have engaged in motorcycle profiling in
- 9 violation of the agency's policy adopted under this article.
- 10 SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2021, each law
- 11 enforcement agency in this state shall adopt the policy required by
- 12 Article 2.1315, Code of Criminal Procedure, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
