| 4  | SECTION 1. Chapter 2, Code of Criminal Procedure, is                |
| 5  | amended by adding Article 2.1315 to read as follows:                |
| 6  | Art. 2.1315. MOTORCYCLE PROFILING PROHIBITED. (a) In this           |
| 7  | article, "motorcycle profiling" means a law enforcement-initiated   |
| 8  | action based, in whole or in part, on an individual operating a     |
| 9  | motorcycle or wearing motorcycle-related or motorcycle              |
| 10 | club-related paraphernalia rather than on the individual's          |
| 11 | behavior or on information identifying the individual as having     |
| 12 | engaged in criminal activity.                                       |
| 13 | (b) A peace officer may not engage in motorcycle profiling.         |
| 14 | SECTION 2. Title 5, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is            |
| 15 | amended by adding Chapter 117 to read as follows:                   |
| 16 | CHAPTER 117. LIABILITY ARISING FROM CONDUCT OF PEACE OFFICERS OR    |
| 17 | LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES  |
| 18 | Sec. 117.001. MOTORCYCLE PROFILING. (a) An individual               |
| 19 | against whom a peace officer has engaged in motorcycle profiling in |
| 20 | violation of Article 2.1315, Code of Criminal Procedure, may bring  |
| 21 | an action against the peace officer or the governmental unit        |
| 22 | employing the peace officer to recover damages arising from the     |
| 23 | motorcycle profiling and for an injunction against future           |
| 24 | violations of that article.   |
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- 1 (b) An individual who establishes in an action under this
- 2 section that a peace officer engaged in motorcycle profiling
- 3 against the individual is entitled to recover reasonable attorney's
- 4 fees and litigation costs.
- 5 (c) A governmental unit is vicariously liable under the
- 6 doctrine of respondeat superior for damages arising from motorcycle
- 7 profiling engaged in by a peace officer employed by the
- 8 governmental unit.
- 9 (d) A governmental unit's sovereign or governmental
- 10 immunity to suit and from liability is waived to the extent of
- 11 liability created by this section.
- 12 <u>(e) A peace officer may not assert official immunity as a</u>
- 13 defense to liability under this section.
- 14 SECTION 3. Chapter 117, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
- 15 as added by this Act, applies only to a cause of action that accrues
- 16 on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
