BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 419.003, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 419.003. SUNSET PROVISION. The Texas Commission on 7 Fire Protection is subject to Chapter 325 (Texas Sunset Act). 8 9 Unless continued in existence as provided by that chapter, the commission is abolished and this chapter expires September 1, 2033 10 11 [2021]. 12 SECTION 2. Section 419.004(d), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 13 14 (d) Appointments to the commission shall be made without regard to the race, color, disability [handicap], sex, religion, 15 16 age, or national origin of the appointees. SECTION 3. Section 419.0071, Government Code, is amended by 17 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d) to read as 18 follows: 19 20 The training program must provide the person with (b) 21 information regarding: 22 (1) the <u>law governing</u> [legislation that created the] 23 commission operations; 24 (2) the programs, functions, rules, and budget of the

No. 1845 1 commission; 2 the scope of and limitations on the rulemaking (3) 3 authority of the commission; 4 (4) the results of the most recent formal audit of the 5 commission; (5) [(4)] the requirements of: 6 7 (A) laws relating to open meetings, public 8 information, administrative procedure, and disclosing conflicts of interest; and 9 10 (B) other laws applicable to members of a state policy-making body in performing their duties; and 11 12 (6) [(5)] any applicable ethics policies adopted by the commission or the Texas Ethics Commission. 13 14 (d) The executive director of the commission shall create a 15 training manual that includes the information required by Subsection (b). The executive director shall distribute a copy of 16 17 the training manual annually to each member of the commission. Each member of the commission shall sign and submit to the executive 18 19 director a statement acknowledging that the member received and has reviewed the training manual. 20 21 SECTION 4. Section 419.008(f), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 2.2 23 (f) The commission may appoint advisory committees to 24 assist it in the performance of its duties. A member of an advisory committee appointed by the commission or otherwise appointed under 25 26 this chapter may not receive compensation for service on the advisory committee. A member appointed under this chapter is 27

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1 entitled to receive reimbursement, subject to any applicable
2 limitation on reimbursement provided by the General Appropriations
3 Act, for actual and necessary expenses incurred in performing
4 services as a member of the advisory committee. <u>Members appointed</u>
5 <u>under this chapter shall serve six-year staggered terms but may not</u>
6 be appointed to consecutive terms.

7 SECTION 5. Section 419.0082, Government Code, is amended to 8 read as follows:

Sec. 419.0082. 9 TIMING OF RULE AMENDMENT OR ADOPTION 10 [RULEMAKING]. (a) [In adopting or amending a rule under Section 419.008(a) or any other law, the commission shall seek the input of 11 12 the fire fighter advisory committee. The commission shall permit 13 the advisory committee to review and comment on any proposed rule, including a proposed amendment to a rule, before the rule is 14 15 adopted. The recommendations of the advisory committee are subject to modification or rejection by the commission, in the commission's 16 17 sole discretion, without the resubmission of the matter to advisory committee. 18

19 [(b)] The commission may not adopt <u>or amend</u> a rule <u>under</u> 20 <u>Section 419.008(a) or any other law</u>[, including an amendment to a 21 rule,] before the commission meeting held after the commission 22 meeting at which the rule is first proposed.

23 (b) [(c)] This section does not apply to an emergency rule 24 adopted under Section 2001.034.

25 [(d) Notwithstanding other provisions of this section, the 26 commission may, without review by an advisory committee, make 27 nonsubstantive clerical changes to a rule.]

SECTION 6. Section 419.011(c), Government Code, is amended
to read as follows:

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3 (c) The commission shall periodically notify the complaint 4 parties of the status of the complaint until final disposition 5 <u>unless the notice would jeopardize an investigation</u>.

6 SECTION 7. Section 419.026(a), Government Code, is amended 7 to read as follows:

The commission shall set and collect a fee for each 8 (a) certificate that the commission issues or renews under this 9 10 subchapter, except that if a person holds more than one certificate the commission may collect only one fee [each year] for the renewal 11 12 of those certificates. The commission by rule shall set the amount of the fee under this subsection in an amount designed to recover 13 14 the commission's costs in connection with issuing certificates 15 under this subchapter, including the cost to the commission of obtaining fingerprint-based criminal history record information 16 17 under Section 419.0325. The employing agency or entity shall pay the fee in the manner prescribed by commission rule. A certificate 18 19 issued under this subchapter is valid for one or two years as determined by commission rule [The certificate must be renewed 20 annually]. 21

22 SECTION 8. Subchapter B, Chapter 419, Government Code, is 23 amended by adding Section 419.0265 to read as follows:

24 <u>Sec. 419.0265. RECIPROCITY. (a) The commission may waive</u> 25 <u>any prerequisite to obtaining a certificate under this subchapter</u> 26 <u>for an applicant who holds a license or certificate issued by</u> 27 <u>another jurisdiction:</u>

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(1) that has licensing or certification requirements
 substantially equivalent to those of this state; or

3 (2) with which this state has a reciprocity agreement.
4 (b) The commission may make an agreement with another state
5 to allow for certification by reciprocity.

6 SECTION 9. Section 419.032(c), Government Code, is amended 7 to read as follows:

8 (c) Fire protection personnel who receive temporary or probationary appointment and who fail to satisfactorily complete a 9 10 basic course in fire protection, as prescribed by the commission, before one year after the date of the original appointment forfeit, 11 12 and shall be removed from, the position. A temporary or probationary appointment may not be extended beyond one year by 13 14 renewal of appointment or otherwise, except that on petition of a 15 fire department one year or more after the date of the forfeiture and removal, the commission may reinstate the person's temporary or 16 17 probationary employment. Fire protection personnel must complete a commission-approved training course in fire suppression before 18 19 being assigned full-time to fire suppression duties. The 20 commission may, on application by a fire department [and after 21 receiving the comments and advice of the fire fighter advisory committee], extend from one year to a period not to exceed two years 22 the time allowed for fire protection personnel receiving a 23 24 temporary or probationary appointment to successfully complete a basic course in fire protection. 25

26 SECTION 10. Sections 419.008(e) and 419.023, Government 27 Code, are repealed.

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1 SECTION 11. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of 2 this section, Section 419.0071, Government Code, as amended by this 3 Act, applies to a member of the Texas Commission on Fire Protection 4 appointed before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.

5 (b) A member of the Texas Commission on Fire Protection who, 6 before the effective date of this Act, completed the training program required by Section 419.0071, Government Code, as the 7 8 applicable law existed before the effective date of this Act, is required to complete additional training only on the subjects added 9 by this Act to the training program required by Section 419.0071, 10 Government Code. A member described by this subsection may not 11 vote, deliberate, or be counted as a member in attendance at a 12 meeting of the commission held on or after December 1, 2021, until 13 14 the member completes the additional training.

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SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
