A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the authority of the Texas Department of Insurance and
- 3 the Texas Windstorm Insurance Association to issue certificates of
- 4 compliance for association coverage.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 2210.251(g), Insurance Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (g) A certificate of compliance issued by the department $\underline{\text{or}}$
- 9 association under Section 2210.2515 demonstrates compliance with
- 10 the applicable building code under the plan of operation. The
- 11 certificate is evidence of insurability of the structure by the
- 12 association.
- SECTION 2. Section 2210.2515, Insurance Code, is amended by
- 14 amending Subsections (c), (c-1), (i), and (k) and adding Subsection
- 15 (f) to read as follows:
- 16 (c) A person may apply to the <u>association</u> [department] on a
- 17 form prescribed by the department for a certificate of compliance
- 18 for a completed improvement. The <u>association</u> [department] shall
- 19 issue a certificate of compliance for a completed improvement if a
- 20 professional engineer licensed by the Texas Board of Professional
- 21 Engineers and Land Surveyors:
- 22 (1) has designed the improvement, has affixed the
- 23 engineer's seal on the design, and submits to the association
- 24 [department] on a form prescribed by the department an affirmation

- 1 that the design complies with the applicable building code under
- 2 the plan of operation and that the improvement was constructed in
- 3 accordance with the design; or
- 4 (2) completes and submits to the <u>association</u>
- 5 [department] a sealed post-construction evaluation report that:
- 6 (A) confirms the improvement's compliance with
- 7 the applicable building code under the plan of operation; and
- 8 (B) includes documentation supporting the
- 9 engineer's post-construction evaluation report on a form
- 10 prescribed by the department on which the engineer has affixed the
- 11 engineer's seal.
- 12 (c-1) The association [department] may deny an application
- 13 for a certificate of compliance under Subsection (c) if the
- 14 evaluation report or the form prescribed by the department under
- 15 Subsection (c)(1) is not fully documented as required under
- 16 Subsection (c).
- 17 (f) If the department determines not to issue a certificate
- 18 of compliance under Subsection (e), a person may apply for a
- 19 certificate of compliance under Subsection (c).
- 20 (i) The association [department] is authorized to submit a
- 21 formal complaint under Chapter 1001, Occupations Code, to the Texas
- 22 Board of Professional Engineers <u>and Land Surveyors</u> related to the
- 23 engineering work of a professional engineer as reflected in the
- 24 sealed post-construction evaluation report or other materials
- 25 submitted by an engineer under Subsection (c).
- 26 (k) The department or association may rescind a certificate
- 27 of compliance issued under this section if the department finds

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- 1 that the improvement does not comply with the applicable building
- 2 code under the plan of operation. The commissioner may adopt rules
- 3 as necessary to implement this subsection.
- 4 SECTION 3. The commissioner of insurance shall adopt rules
- 5 to implement this Act not later than December 31, 2021.
- 6 SECTION 4. Section 2210.2515, Insurance Code, as amended by
- 7 this Act, applies only to an application for a certificate of
- 8 compliance made on or after January 1, 2022. An application for a
- 9 certificate of compliance made before January 1, 2022, is governed
- 10 by the law as it existed immediately before the effective date of
- 11 this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
