## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to emergency refills of insulin and insulin-related
3	equipment or supplies.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 562, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 562.0541 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 562.0541. EMERGENCY REFILLS OF INSULIN AND
8	INSULIN-RELATED EQUIPMENT OR SUPPLIES. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Insulin" includes an insulin analog and ar
10	insulin-like medication, regardless of the activation period or
11	whether the solution is mixed before the prescription is dispensed.
12	(2) "Insulin-related equipment or supplies" includes
13	needles, syringes, cartridge systems, prefilled pen systems,
14	glucose meters, and test strips, but excludes insulin pumps.
15	(b) A pharmacist may provide an emergency refill of insulir
16	or insulin-related equipment or supplies if the pharmacist:
17	(1) successfully completes a training program adopted
18	by the board under Subsection (g); and
19	(2) complies with this section and rules adopted under
20	this section.
21	(c) Notwithstanding Section 562.054(a) and subject to

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Subsection (b) of this section, a pharmacist may exercise the

pharmacist's professional judgment in refilling a prescription for

insulin or insulin-related equipment or supplies without the

- 1 <u>authorization of the prescribing practitioner if the pharmacist:</u>
- 2 (1) is unable to contact the practitioner after
- 3 reasonable effort;
- 4 (2) is provided with documentation showing that the
- 5 patient was previously prescribed insulin or insulin-related
- 6 equipment or supplies by a practitioner;
- 7 (3) assesses the patient to determine whether the
- 8 emergency refill is appropriate;
- 9 (4) creates a record that documents the patient's
- 10 visit that includes a notation describing the documentation
- 11 provided under Subdivision (2); and
- 12 (5) makes a reasonable attempt to inform the
- 13 practitioner of the emergency refill at the earliest reasonable
- 14 time.
- 15 (d) The quantity of an emergency refill of insulin may not
- 16 exceed a 30-day supply. The quantity of an emergency refill of
- 17 insulin-related equipment or supplies may not exceed the lesser of
- 18 a 30-day supply or the smallest available package.
- 19 (e) A pharmacist may not dispense an emergency refill of
- 20 insulin or insulin-related equipment or supplies to an individual
- 21 patient more than three times in a calendar year.
- 22 <u>(f) The prescribing practitioner is not liable for an act or</u>
- 23 omission by a pharmacist in dispensing an emergency refill of
- 24 insulin or insulin-related equipment or supplies under this
- 25 section.
- 26 (g) The board shall adopt a training program on dispensing
- 27 emergency refills of insulin and insulin-related equipment or

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- 1 supplies that is accredited by the Accreditation Council for
- 2 Pharmacy Education or by that council's successor organization.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 1358.054, Insurance Code, is amended by
- 4 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 5 (a-1) A health benefit plan described by Subsection (a) must
- 6 provide to each qualified enrollee coverage for emergency refills
- 7 of diabetes equipment or diabetes supplies dispensed to the
- 8 <u>enrollee in accordance with Section 562.0541, Occupations Code, in</u>
- 9 the same manner as for a nonemergency refill of diabetes equipment
- 10 or diabetes supplies.
- 11 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 12 of this Act, the Texas State Board of Pharmacy shall adopt a
- 13 training course required by Section 562.0541, Occupations Code, as
- 14 added by this Act, and adopt rules necessary to implement that
- 15 section.
- SECTION 4. Section 1358.054, Insurance Code, as amended by
- 17 this Act, applies only to a health benefit plan that is delivered,
- 18 issued for delivery, or renewed on or after January 1, 2022.
- 19 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
