4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 74.501(d), Property Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(d) On receipt of a claim form and all necessary
8	documentation and as may be appropriate under the circumstances,
9	the comptroller may approve the claim of:
10	(1) the reported owner of the property;
11	(2) if the reported owner died testate:
12	(A) the appropriate legal beneficiaries of the

- 13 owner as provided by the last will and testament of the owner that
- 14 has been accepted into probate or filed as a muniment of title; or
- 15 (B) the executor of the owner's last will and
- testament who holds current letters testamentary; 16
- 17 (3) if the reported owner died intestate:
- (A) the legal heirs of the owner as provided by 18
- Sections 201.001 and 201.002, Estates Code; or 19
- 20 (B) the court-appointed administrator of
- owner's estate, if the administrator was appointed before the 21
- 22 fourth anniversary of the date of the death of the owner;
- 23 (4) the legal heirs of the reported owner
- established by an affidavit of heirship order signed by a judge of 24

- 1 the county probate court or by a county judge;
- 2 (5) if the reported owner is a minor child or an adult
- 3 who has been adjudged incompetent by a court of law, the parent or
- 4 legal guardian of the child or adult;
- 5 (6) if the reported owner is a corporation:
- 6 (A) the president or chair of the board of
- 7 directors of the corporation, on behalf of the corporation; or
- 8 (B) any person who has legal authority to act on
- 9 behalf of the corporation;
- 10 (7) if the reported owner is a corporation that has
- 11 been dissolved or liquidated:
- 12 (A) the sole surviving shareholder of the
- 13 corporation, if there is only one surviving shareholder;
- 14 (B) the surviving shareholders of the
- 15 corporation in proportion to their ownership of the corporation, if
- 16 there is more than one surviving shareholder;
- 17 (C) the corporation's bankruptcy trustee; or
- 18 (D) the court-ordered receiver for the
- 19 corporation; [or]
- 20 (8) a person holding a limited power of attorney from
- 21 the reported owner or the owner's heirs that authorizes the person
- 22 to receive the unclaimed property; or
- 23 <u>(9)</u> any other person that is entitled to receive the
- 24 unclaimed property under other law or comptroller policy.
- 25 SECTION 2. Section 74.501(e), Property Code, as amended by
- 26 Chapters 267 (S.B. 1420) and 897 (H.B. 3598), Acts of the 86th
- 27 Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, is reenacted and amended to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 (e) Except as provided by Subsection (f) or Section 551.051,
- 3 Estates Code, the comptroller may not pay to the following persons a
- 4 claim to which this section applies:
- 5 (1) a creditor, a judgment creditor, a lienholder, or
- 6 an assignee of the reported owner or of the owner's heirs; or
- 7 (2) [a person holding a power of attorney from the
- 8 reported owner or the owner's heirs; or
- 9 $\left[\frac{(3)}{(3)}\right]$ a person attempting to make a claim on behalf of
- 10 a corporation that was previously forfeited, dissolved, or
- 11 terminated, if the comptroller finds that:
- 12 (A) the corporation was revived for the purpose
- 13 of making a claim under this section; and
- 14 (B) the person submitting the claim was not an
- 15 authorized representative of the corporation at the time of the
- 16 corporation's forfeiture, dissolution, or termination.
- 17 SECTION 3. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 18 over another Act of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021,
- 19 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 20 codes.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
