A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the membership of a school district's threat assessment
- 3 and safe and supportive school team and committee and the school
- 4 safety allotment under the public school finance system.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 37.108(b-1), Education Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (b-1) In a school district's safety and security audit
- 9 required under Subsection (b), the district must certify that the
- 10 district used the funds provided to the district through the school
- 11 safety allotment under Section 48.115 [42.168] only for the
- 12 purposes provided by that section.
- SECTION 2. Sections 37.115(d) and (e), Education Code, are
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (d) The superintendent of the district shall ensure that the
- 16 members appointed to each team have expertise in counseling,
- 17 behavior management, mental health and substance use, classroom
- 18 instruction, special education, school administration, school
- 19 safety and security, $\underline{\text{and}}$ emergency management[, $\underline{\text{and}}$ law
- 20 enforcement]. A team may serve more than one campus of a school
- 21 district, provided that each district campus is assigned a team.
- (e) The superintendent of a school district may establish a
- 23 committee, or assign to an existing committee established by the
- 24 district, the duty to oversee the operations of teams established

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- 1 for the district. A committee with oversight responsibility under
- 2 this subsection must include members with expertise in human
- 3 resources, education, special education, counseling, behavior
- 4 management, school administration, mental health and substance
- 5 use, school safety and security, and emergency management[, and law
- 6 enforcement].
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 42.168, Education Code, as added by
- 8 Chapter 464 (S.B. 11), Acts of the 86th Legislature, Regular
- 9 Session, 2019, is transferred to Subchapter C, Chapter 48,
- 10 Education Code, redesignated as Section 48.115, Education Code,
- 11 amended to conform to changes made by Chapter 943 (H.B. 3), Acts of
- 12 the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, and further amended to
- 13 read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 48.115 [42.168]. SCHOOL SAFETY ALLOTMENT. (a) From
- 15 funds appropriated for that purpose, the commissioner shall provide
- 16 to a school district an annual allotment in the amount provided by
- 17 appropriation for each student in average daily attendance.
- 18 (b) Funds allocated under this section must be used to
- 19 improve school safety and security, including costs associated
- 20 with:
- 21 (1) securing school facilities, including:
- 22 (A) improvements to school infrastructure;
- 23 (B) the use or installation of physical barriers;
- 24 and
- 25 (C) the purchase and maintenance of:
- 26 (i) security cameras or other security
- 27 equipment; and

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1	(ii) technology, including communications
2	systems or devices, that facilitates communication and information
3	sharing between students, school personnel, and first responders in
4	an emergency;
5	(2) [providing security for the district, including:
6	[(A) employing school district peace officers,
7	private security officers, and school marshals; and
8	[(B) collaborating with local law enforcement
9	agencies, such as entering into a memorandum of understanding for
10	the assignment of school resource officers to schools in the
11	district;
12	$\left[\frac{(3)}{3}\right]$ school safety and security training and
13	planning, including:
14	(A) active shooter and emergency response
15	training;
16	(B) prevention and treatment programs relating
17	to addressing adverse childhood experiences; and
18	(C) the prevention, identification, and
19	management of emergencies and threats, using evidence-based,
20	effective prevention practices and including:
21	(i) providing <u>licensed counselors</u> , social
22	workers, social-emotional learning coordinators, and individuals
23	trained in restorative discipline and restorative justice
24	<pre>practices;</pre>
25	(ii) providing mental health personnel and
26	support;
27	(iii) [(ii)] providing behavioral health

- 2 (iv) [(iii)] establishing threat reporting
- 3 systems; and
- 4 (v) developing and implementing programs
- 5 focused on social-emotional learning, restorative justice
- 6 practices, culturally relevant instruction, and providing mental
- 7 <u>health support; and</u>
- 8 $\underline{(3)}$ [$\overline{(4)}$] providing programs related to suicide
- 9 prevention, intervention, and postvention.
- 10 (c) A school district may use funds allocated under this
- 11 section for equipment or software that is used for a school safety
- 12 and security purpose and an instructional purpose, provided that
- 13 the instructional use does not compromise the safety and security
- 14 purpose of the equipment or software.
- 15 (d) The commissioner shall annually publish a report
- 16 regarding funds allocated under this section including the
- 17 programs, personnel, and resources purchased by districts using
- 18 funds under this section and other purposes for which the funds were
- 19 <u>used</u> [A school district that is required to take action under
- 20 Chapter 41 to reduce its wealth per student to the equalized wealth
- 21 level is entitled to a credit, in the amount of the allotments to
- 22 which the district is to receive as provided by appropriation,
- 23 against the total amount required under Section 41.093 for the
- 24 district to purchase attendance credits].
- 25 [(e) The commissioner may adopt rules to implement this
- 26 section.
- 27 SECTION 4. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails

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- 1 over another Act of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021,
- 2 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 3 codes.
- 4 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
