5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
7	Subchapter W to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER W. REGIONAL POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION
9	COLLABORATIVES GRANT PROGRAM
10	Sec. 61.931. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
11	(1) "Low-income student" means a student who is
12	eligible to receive a grant under the federal Pell Grant program or
13	has equivalent need, as determined by board rule.
14	(2) "Regional postsecondary education collaborative"
15	means a partnership or other collaboration between stakeholders in
16	education that is focused on improving postsecondary educational
17	outcomes in a region of the state.
18	Sec. 61.932. GRANT PROGRAM. (a) The board shall establish
19	and administer a competitive grant program under which the board
20	awards grants to eligible regional postsecondary education
21	collaboratives to improve postsecondary educational outcomes for
22	low-income students in the state.
23	(b) In awarding grants under the program, the board shall
24	give priority to eligible regional postsecondary education

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1	collaboratives that:
2	(1) focus on supporting low-income students; or
3	(2) have a demonstrated connection to targeted
4	workforce fields, as determined by the board.
5	Sec. 61.933. ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible to receive a grant
6	under this subchapter, a regional postsecondary education
7	collaborative must:
8	(1) include at least one school district and public
9	junior college;
10	(2) raise a minimum amount of funding from other
11	sources for the collaborative's costs, as established by board
12	<u>rule;</u>
13	(3) develop and submit to the board a plan detailing
14	how the collaborative would use grant funds awarded under this
15	subchapter in a manner permitted under Section 61.935;
16	(4) build partnerships committed to changing
17	postsecondary education systems and improving postsecondary
18	educational outcomes through the use of data, mutual
19	accountability, and engagement between a student and the student's
20	<pre>community;</pre>
21	(5) measure the collaborative's success by achievement
22	of increasing postsecondary enrollment and completion at any
23	institution of higher education or private or independent
24	institution of higher education and career entry for all students
25	the collaborative assists;
26	(6) provide personalized outreach to students and
27	parents or caregivers;

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1	(7) provide proactive, holistic supports to assist
2	students in postsecondary persistence and completion and in
3	connecting with employers; and
4	(8) satisfy any additional requirements established
5	by board rule.
6	Sec. 61.934. GRANT AMOUNT. (a) A grant awarded to an
7	eligible regional postsecondary education collaborative under the
8	program must be made for a period sufficient to cover the enrollment
9	in, persistence in, and timely completion of a certificate or
10	degree program for two consecutive cohorts of students.
11	(b) Each grant consists of, for each cohort:
12	(1) an initial amount at the beginning of the first
13	academic year for which the grant is awarded equal to \$1,000 for
14	each low-income student who:
15	(A) graduated in the preceding school year from a
16	high school participating in the collaborative; and
17	(B) enrolls at an institution of higher education
18	or a private or independent institution of higher education for
19	that academic year; and
20	(2) at the end of each academic year for which the
21	grant is awarded, a bonus for each student described by Subdivision
22	(1) who:
23	(A) persists, as determined by board rule, at an
24	institution of higher education or a private or independent
25	institution of higher education; or

(c) Subject to Subsection (e), the bonus per student under 3 Subsection (b)(2)(A) is an amount equal to \$25 million divided by 4 5 the total number of students who qualify for the bonus. 6 (d) Subject to Subsection (e), the bonus per student under 7 Subsection (b)(2)(B) is an amount equal to \$20 million divided by 8 the total number of students who qualify for the bonus. 9 (e) The amount of a bonus under Subsection (b)(2)(A) or (B) may not exceed \$2,000 per student. 10 Sec. 61.935. GRANT USE. A grant awarded to an eligible 11 12 regional postsecondary education collaborative under this subchapter may be used only for: 13 14 (1) staff support for the collaborative; 15 (2) student services designed to increase postsecondary enrollment, persistence, and completion; 16 (3) student <u>financial assistance;</u> 17 (4) programs that provide training for jobs 18 in 19 targeted workforce fields, as determined by the board; and 20 (5) other expenses approved by the board. 21 Sec. 61.936. REPORTING. (a) Each regional postsecondary education collaborative that receives a grant under this subchapter 22 shall collect and report to the board information regarding 23 24 postsecondary enrollment, persistence, and completion, disaggregated by category and semester or term, as required by the 25 26 board to assist the board in fulfilling its duties under this 27 subchapter.

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(b) Not later than December 1 of each year, the board shall
 submit to the legislature a report on the effectiveness of the grant
 program established under this subchapter and any recommendations
 for legislative or other action.
 Sec. 61.937. RULES. The board may adopt rules as necessary
 to implement this subchapter.

Sec. 61.938. FEDERAL FUNDING CONTINGENCY. The board is 7 required to implement the grant program established under this 8 subchapter only if federal funding is provided to the board for that 9 purpose as part of any federal coronavirus disease (COVID-19) 10 relief spending appropriated on or after January 1, 2021. If such 11 12 funding is not provided for that purpose, the board may, but is not required to, implement the grant program using other money 13 14 available to the board for that purpose.

15 SECTION 2. (a) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating 16 Board shall adopt rules to administer Subchapter W, Chapter 61, 17 Education Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable after 18 the effective date of this Act.

(b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
begin awarding grants under Subchapter W, Chapter 61, Education
Code, as added by this Act, for the first academic year for which
federal funding is appropriated for that purpose.

23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
