4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 61.06696 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 61.06696. STUDY REGARDING ESTABLISHMENT OF FOUR-YEAR
8	INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN TEXAS-MEXICO BORDER REGION. (a)
9	The board shall conduct a study to examine the need for and
10	feasibility of establishing a four-year institution of higher
11	education in the Texas-Mexico border region served by Sul Ross
12	State University Rio Grande College.
13	(b) The study must identify and examine:
14	(1) the impact of Sul Ross State University Rio Grande
15	College on the region, including;
16	(A) the number of students served by Sul Ross
17	State University Rio Grande College; and
18	(B) the graduation rates of students served by
19	Sul Ross State University Rio Grande College;
20	(2) the challenges related to the distance between the
21	campuses of Sul Ross State University Rio Grande College and Sul
22	Ross State University;
23	(3) the gaps in educational opportunities that exist
24	for students in the region and the effect of those gaps on local

- 2 (4) the feasibility of establishing an institution
- 3 described by Subsection (a) in the city of Eagle Pass.
- 4 (c) The board shall prepare a written report that:
- 5 (1) identifies the challenges related to establishing
- 6 a new institution of higher education in the region;
- 7 (2) includes recommendations for legislative or other
- 8 action; and
- 9 (3) includes any other matter the board considers
- 10 appropriate.
- 11 (d) Not later than December 1, 2022, the board shall submit
- 12 the written report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the
- 13 speaker of the house of representatives, and the chair of each
- 14 standing committee of the legislature with jurisdiction over higher
- 15 <u>education</u>.
- (e) This section expires September 1, 2023.
- 17 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
