8	Sec. 608.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Air conditioning system" means a heating,
10	ventilation, and air conditioning system that provides heating and
11	cooling to a building.
12	(2) "Residential real property" has the meaning
13	assigned by Section 22.001.
14	(3) "Warrantor" means a person who is contractually
15	obligated to repair or replace a product under a warranty
16	agreement.
17	Sec. 608.002. TRANSFER OF MANUFACTURER'S WARRANTY. (a) If
18	residential real property that includes an air conditioning system
19	as a fixture to the property is conveyed to a new owner, a
20	manufacturer's warranty in effect on that system or a component of
21	that system on the date of the conveyance:
22	(1) is automatically transferred to the new owner; and
23	(2) continues in effect as if the new owner was the
24	original purchaser of the system or component, as applicable.

(b) A warrantor continues to be obligated under the terms of 1 2 a manufacturer's warranty agreement for a warranty transferred under this section and may not charge a fee for the transfer of the 3 4 warranty. 5 (c) The transfer of a manufacturer's warranty under this 6 section does not extend the original term of the warranty 7 agreement. 8 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only to a warranty agreement entered into or renewed on or after the 9 effective date of this Act. A warranty agreement entered into or 10 renewed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law 11 in effect on the date the agreement was entered into or renewed, and 12 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021. 14
