A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the determination of whether work is suitable for an
- 3 individual for the purpose of determining the individual's
- 4 unemployment compensation benefit eligibility.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 207.008(b), Labor Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subtitle,
- 9 work is not suitable and benefits may not be denied under this
- 10 subtitle to an otherwise eligible individual for refusal to accept
- 11 new work if:
- 12 (1) the position offered is vacant directly because of
- 13 a strike, lockout, or other labor dispute;
- 14 (2) the wages, hours, or other conditions of the work
- 15 offered are substantially less favorable to the individual than
- 16 those prevailing for similar work in the locality; [or]
- 17 (3) as a condition of being employed, the individual
- 18 is required to join a company union or to resign from or refrain
- 19 from joining a bona fide labor organization;
- 20 (4) the place of performance of the work offered is in
- 21 violation of federal, state, or local protocols relating to the
- 22 spread of infectious diseases, including COVID-19; or
- 23 (5) the work offered presents an unreasonable risk of
- 24 exposure to infectious diseases, including COVID-19, that cannot be

1 <u>mitigated with reasonable care</u>.

- 2 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 3 to a claim for unemployment compensation benefits filed with the
- 4 Texas Workforce Commission on or after the effective date of this
- 5 Act. A claim filed before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 6 by the law in effect on the date the claim was filed, and the former
- 7 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
