A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to a study on state land use to facilitate health and
- 3 wellness for veterans.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. STUDY REGARDING STATE LAND USE FOR VETERANS. (a)
- 6 In collaboration with the General Land Office, the Texas Historical
- 7 Commission, and the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, the Texas
- 8 Veterans Commission shall conduct a study to identify and assess
- 9 the use of state land, including state parks, for the purpose of
- 10 facilitating health and wellness for veterans.
- 11 (b) In conducting the study, the Texas Veterans Commission
- 12 shall:
- 13 (1) identify barriers that limit opportunities to
- 14 supplement the delivery to veterans of services for health and
- 15 wellness through the use of outdoor recreation on state land; and
- 16 (2) develop recommendations to better facilitate the
- 17 use of state land for promoting wellness and facilitating the
- 18 delivery of health care and therapeutic interventions for veterans.
- 19 SECTION 2. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. Not later than November
- 20 1, 2022, the Texas Veterans Commission shall submit to the
- 21 governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of
- 22 representatives, and appropriate standing committees of the
- 23 legislature with jurisdiction over veterans' issues a report on the
- 24 results of the study conducted under Section 1 of this Act and any

- 1 recommendations of the commission related to the study, including
- 2 any statutory changes necessary to authorize the use of state land
- 3 for the health and wellness of veterans.
- 4 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION. This Act expires September 1, 2023.
- 5 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 6 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 7 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 8 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 9 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
