## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the eligibility of certain retired firefighters and emergency medical services providers to purchase continued health 3 benefits coverage. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 175.001, Local Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 Sec. 175.001. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies to a 8 9 person who: (1) retires from: 10 11 (A) county employment in a county with а 12 population of 75,000 or more; employment by an appraisal district in a 13 (B) 14 county with a population of 75,000 or more; [or] 15 (C) municipal employment in a municipality with a population of 25,000 or more; or 16 (D) employment as a firefighter or emergency 17 medical services provider by an emergency services district located 18 wholly or partly in a county with a population of 200,000 or more; 19 20 and 21 (2) is entitled to receive retirement benefits from a 22 county, appraisal district, or municipal retirement plan or 23 emergency services district. SECTION 2. (a) Chapter 175, Local Government Code, 24 as

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1 amended by this Act, applies according to its terms to all eligible 2 persons who leave employment with an emergency services district on 3 or after January 1, 2022.

4 (b) An emergency services district that is required by Chapter 175, Local Government Code, as amended by this Act, to 5 provide continued health benefits coverage but that is not allowed 6 to provide the coverage under the terms of the district's existing 7 8 group health plan shall ensure that the required continued health benefits coverage is provided for in any new plan that is adopted by 9 the district on or after January 1, 2022, unless the district is 10 exempted under Section 175.007, Local Government Code. 11

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
