- 5 SECTION 1. Section 644.101(c), Transportation Code, as
- 6 amended by Chapters 169 (H.B. 917) and 478 (H.B. 511), Acts of the
- 7 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, is reenacted and amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (c) A sheriff or a deputy sheriff of any of the following
- 10 counties is eligible to apply for certification under this section:
- 11 (1) a county bordering the United Mexican States;
- 12 (2) a county with a population of less than 1,000, part
- of which is located within 75 miles of an international border; [or]
- 14 (3)  $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$  a county with a population of 700,000 or
- 15 more; [<del>or</del>]
- 16 (4)  $\left[\frac{(3)}{(3)}\right]$  a county with a population of 400,000 or
- 17 more that borders the county in which the State Capitol is located;
- 18 <u>or</u>
- (5) a county with a population of more than 40,000 and
- 20 less than 300,000 that is adjacent to a county described by
- 21 <u>Subdivision (4)</u>.
- 22 SECTION 2. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 23 over another Act of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021,
- 24 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted

- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
