A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a study by the Texas Department of Transportation or
3	future transportation needs for the year 2045.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "department" means the 6 Texas Department of Transportation.
- 7 SECTION 2. STUDY. (a) The department, in consultation with 8 the Texas A&M Transportation Institute, shall conduct a study on
- 9 the state's projected transportation needs, costs, and the 10 resulting benefits of meeting those needs for the year 2045.
- 11 (b) The study must:
- 12 (1) use models from the state's metropolitan planning 13 organizations and rural planning efforts to capture regional and 14 local transportation needs;
- 15 (2) incorporate current, high quality vehicle-based 16 data sources to analyze changing travel patterns and behaviors;
- 17 (3) develop a forecast for alternative levels of 18 mobility and infrastructure performance for:
- 19 (A) highway maintenance;
- 20 (B) urban mobility; and
- 21 (C) rural connectivity;
- (4) develop a range of future state transportation performance and infrastructure condition goals for the period covered by the study;

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- 1 (5) develop and evaluate potential scenarios to
- 2 account for:
- 3 (A) innovations in vehicle technologies;
- 4 (B) changes in travel behavior;
- 5 (C) changes in workplace policies; and
- 6 (D) strategies for innovative project design and
- 7 development;
- 8 (6) evaluate current funding levels and dedicated
- 9 funding streams, including anticipated funds transferred to the
- 10 state highway fund under Section 49-g, Article III, Texas
- 11 Constitution, or deposited to that fund under Section 7-c, Article
- 12 VIII, Texas Constitution, to quantify the gap between likely
- 13 funding and the amount required to meet a range of performance
- 14 conditions;
- 15 (7) identify strategies and funding options to fill
- 16 any gaps in transportation needs; and
- 17 (8) overlay information in the 2030 Committee's 2011
- 18 report analysis for the period from 2010 to 2035 to compare the
- 19 funding landscape and performance expectations in 2011 with the
- 20 current outlook.
- 21 SECTION 3. COMMITTEE. The Texas Transportation Commission
- 22 shall appoint a committee composed of experienced and respected
- 23 business and community leaders in this state to provide guidance
- 24 and direction to the department and the Texas A&M Transportation
- 25 Institute for purposes of conducting the study required by this
- 26 Act.
- 27 SECTION 4. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. Not later than December

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- 1 1, 2022, the Texas Department of Transportation shall submit a
- 2 report to the legislature that includes the results of the study
- 3 conducted under this Act and any associated recommendations.
- 4 SECTION 5. EXPIRATION. This Act expires January 1, 2023.
- 5 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 6 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 7 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 8 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 9 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
