5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 5, Local Government Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 179 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 179. ILLNESS OR INJURY LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR COUNTY AND

- 9 MUNICIPAL FIREFIGHTERS, POLICE OFFICERS, AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL
- 10 SERVICES PERSONNEL
- Sec. 179.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: 11
- (1) "Emergency medical services personnel" has the 12
- meaning assigned by Section 773.003, Health and Safety Code. 13
- 14 (2) "Firefighter" means a firefighter who is a
- permanent, paid employee of the fire department of a county or 15
- municipality. The term includes the chief of the department. The 16
- term does not include a volunteer firefighter. 17
- (3) "Police officer" means a paid employee who is 18
- 19 sworn, certified, and full-time, and who regularly serves in a
- professional law enforcement capacity in the police department of a 20
- county or municipality. The term includes the chief of the 21
- 22 department.
- Sec. 179.002. EFFECT ON LABOR AGREEMENTS. Notwithstanding 23
- 24 any other law, including Section 142.067, 142.117, 143.207,

- 1 143.307, 143.361, 147.004, or 174.005, a collective bargaining,
- 2 meet and confer, or other similar agreement that provides a benefit
- 3 for an ill or injured employee must provide a benefit that, at a
- 4 minimum, complies with this chapter.
- 5 Sec. 179.003. LINE OF DUTY ILLNESS OR INJURY LEAVE OF
- 6 ABSENCE. (a) A county or municipality shall provide to a
- 7 firefighter, police officer, or emergency medical services
- 8 personnel a leave of absence for an illness or injury related to the
- 9 person's line of duty. The leave is with full pay for a period
- 10 commensurate with the nature of the line of duty illness or injury.
- 11 If necessary, the leave shall continue for at least one year.
- 12 (b) At the end of the one-year period, the county's or
- 13 municipality's governing body may extend the line of duty illness
- 14 or injury leave at full or reduced pay. If the firefighter's,
- 15 police officer's, or emergency medical services personnel's leave
- 16 <u>is not extended or the person's salary is reduced below 60 percent</u>
- 17 of the person's regular monthly salary and the person is a member of
- 18 a pension fund, the person may retire on pension until able to
- 19 return to duty.
- 20 (c) If pension benefits are not available to a firefighter,
- 21 police officer, or emergency medical services personnel who is
- 22 temporarily disabled by a line of duty injury or illness and if the
- 23 year at full pay and any extensions granted by the governing body
- 24 have expired, the firefighter, police officer, or emergency medical
- 25 services personnel may use accumulated sick leave, vacation time,
- 26 and other accrued benefits before the person is placed on temporary
- 27 leave.

- 1 (d) If the year at full pay and any extensions granted by the
- 2 governing body have expired, the firefighter, police officer, or
- 3 emergency medical services personnel is placed on temporary leave.
- 4 Sec. 179.004. OTHER ILLNESS OR INJURY LEAVE OF ABSENCE. A
- 5 firefighter, police officer, or emergency medical services
- 6 personnel who is temporarily disabled by an injury or illness that
- 7 is not related to the person's line of duty may:
- 8 <u>(1) use accumulated sick leave, vacation time, and</u>
- 9 other accrued benefits before the person is placed on temporary
- 10 <u>leave; or</u>
- 11 (2) have another firefighter, police officer, or
- 12 emergency medical services personnel volunteer to do the person's
- 13 work while the person is temporarily disabled by the injury or
- 14 illness.
- Sec. 179.005. RETURN TO DUTY. (a) If able, a firefighter,
- 16 police officer, or emergency medical services personnel may return
- 17 to light duty while recovering from a temporary disability. If
- 18 medically necessary, the light duty assignment may continue for at
- 19 least one year.
- 20 (b) After recovery from a temporary disability, a
- 21 <u>firefighter</u>, police officer, or emergency medical services
- 22 personnel shall be reinstated at the same rank and with the same
- 23 seniority the person had before going on temporary leave. Another
- 24 firefighter, police officer, or emergency medical services
- 25 personnel may voluntarily do the work of an injured firefighter,
- 26 police officer, or emergency medical services personnel until the
- 27 person returns to duty.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 179.002, Local Government Code, as added
- 2 by this Act, applies only to a collective bargaining, meet and
- 3 confer, or other similar agreement entered into on or after the
- 4 effective date of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
