## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation and uses of the critical infrastructure
3	resiliency fund and the eligibility of certain water-related
4	projects for state financial assistance.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 418, Government Code, is amended by
7	adding Subchapter J to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER J. CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE RESILIENCY FUND
9	Sec. 418.301. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "fund" means
10	the critical infrastructure resiliency fund.
11	Sec. 418.302. CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE RESILIENCY FUND. (a)
12	The critical infrastructure resiliency fund is a special fund in
13	the state treasury outside the general revenue fund.
14	(b) The fund may be used by the division, without further
15	legislative appropriation, only as provided by this subchapter.
16	(c) The fund consists of:
17	(1) legislative appropriations to the division for a
18	purpose of the fund;
19	(2) any revenue that by law is dedicated for deposit to
20	the fund;
21	(3) interest or other earnings on money credited to or
22	allocable to the fund;
23	(4) money from gifts, grants, or donations to the
24	fund; and

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1	(5) money under the division's control that the
2	division designates for deposit to the fund.
3	Sec. 418.303. USE OF FUND. The division may use the fund
4	only to:
5	(1) make a grant to an eligible entity under this
6	subchapter; and
7	(2) pay the necessary and reasonable expenses of
8	administering the fund.
9	Sec. 418.304. ELECTRIC GRID IMPROVEMENT ACCOUNT. (a) The
10	electric grid improvement account is an account in the fund.
11	(b) The account consists of:
12	(1) legislative appropriations to the division for a
13	purpose of the account; and
14	(2) money from gifts, grants, or donations to the
15	division for a purpose of the account.
16	(c) Subject to Subsection (d), the division may use the
17	account only to make matching grants to eligible entities for
18	hardening and weatherizing the electric grid, including:
19	(1) installing advanced meter infrastructure;
20	(2) improving load shed capabilities;
21	(3) incentivizing customers to engage in distributed
22	energy production and energy efficiency measures;
23	(4) installing electric energy storage; and
24	(5) weatherizing facilities.
25	(d) The division may not use the account to make grants for
26	routine vegetation management.
27	(e) An entity is eligible to receive a matching grant under

1	this section only if the entity is:
2	(1) a municipally owned electric utility;
3	(2) an electric cooperative;
4	(3) a transmission and distribution utility, as
5	defined by Section 31.002, Utilities Code; or
6	(4) a vertically integrated utility.
7	(f) In making grants under this section, the division:
8	(1) shall consider:
9	(A) the expected number of individuals who will
10	benefit from the project;
11	(B) existing infrastructure and overall need for
12	the project;
13	(C) the potential benefit of the project to:
14	(i) low-income communities; and
15	(ii) areas in disparate parts of the state;
16	(D) the equitable distribution of grants
17	throughout the state;
18	(E) the existence of matching federal funds for
19	the project and whether available federal funds have been
20	exhausted; and
21	(F) the total impact of the project on the
22	resiliency of the state's electric grid; and
23	(2) may consult with the Public Utility Commission of
24	Texas.
25	(g) The division shall condition each grant awarded under
26	this section on the grant recipient providing funds from non-state
27	sources in a total amount at least equal to 10 percent of the grant

1	amount, with at least five percent of the recipient's match coming
2	from local sources.
3	Sec. 418.305. HOSPITAL INFRASTRUCTURE RESILIENCY ACCOUNT.
4	(a) The hospital infrastructure resiliency account is an account
5	in the fund.
6	(b) The account consists of:
7	(1) legislative appropriations to the division for a
8	purpose of the account; and
9	(2) money from gifts, grants, or donations to the
10	division for a purpose of the account.
11	(c) The division may use the account only to make matching
12	grants to eligible entities for purchasing reserve power supply,
13	such as on-site generation and energy storage systems, necessary to
14	sustain critical medical care.
15	(d) An entity is eligible to receive a matching grant under
16	this section only if the entity is:
17	(1) a hospital owned by a municipality; or
18	(2) a private for-profit or nonprofit hospital.
19	(e) In making grants under this section, the division:
20	(1) shall consider:
21	(A) the expected number of individuals who will
22	benefit from the project;
23	(B) existing infrastructure and overall need for
24	the project;
25	(C) the potential benefit of the project to:
26	(i) low-income communities; and
27	(ii) areas in disparate parts of the state;

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1	(D) the equitable distribution of grants
2	throughout the state;
3	(E) the existence of matching federal funds for
4	the project and whether available federal funds have been
5	exhausted; and
6	(F) the total impact of the project on the

8	(2) may consult with the Health and Human Services

15	Sec. 418.306. NURSING HOME RESILIENCY ACCOUNT. (a) The
16	nursing home resiliency account is an account in the fund.
17	(b) The account consists of:
18	(1) legislative appropriations to the division for a
19	purpose of the account; and
20	(2) money from gifts, grants, or donations to the
21	division for a purpose of the account.
22	(c) The division may use the account only to make matching
23	grants to institutions licensed under Chapter 242, Health and
24	Safety Code, for purchasing reserve power supply, such as on-site
25	generation and energy storage systems, necessary to sustain
26	critical medical care.
27	(d) In making grants under this section, the division may

1	consult with the Health and Human Services Commission.
2	(e) If the division receives more qualifying applications
3	for a grant under this section than the division has available money
4	to fully fund, the division may reduce the amount of each grant made
5	under this section in proportion to the number of individuals
6	served by the grant applicant.
7	(f) The division shall condition each grant awarded under
8	this section on the grant recipient providing funds from non-state
9	sources in a total amount at least equal to 10 percent of the grant
10	amount, with at least five percent of the recipient's match coming
11	from local sources.
12	Sec. 418.307. DIALYSIS INFRASTRUCTURE ACCOUNT. (a) The
13	dialysis infrastructure account is an account in the fund.
14	(b) The account consists of:
15	(1) legislative appropriations to the division for a
16	purpose of the account; and
17	(2) money from gifts, grants, or donations to the
18	division for a purpose of the account.
19	(c) The division may use the account only to make matching
20	grants to end stage renal disease facilities, as defined by Section
21	251.001, Health and Safety Code, for purchasing reserve power
22	supply, such as on-site generation and energy storage systems,
23	necessary to sustain critical medical care.
24	(d) In making grants under this section, the division:
25	(1) shall consider:
26	(A) the expected number of individuals who will
27	benefit from the project;

2 SECTION 6. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this
3 section, this Act takes effect January 1, 2022.

4 (b) Section 1 of this Act takes effect January 1, 2022, but 5 only if the constitutional amendment proposed by the 87th 6 Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, providing for the creation of 7 the critical infrastructure resiliency fund to assist in the 8 financing of certain infrastructure projects is approved by the 9 voters. If that amendment is not approved by the voters, that 10 section has no effect.
