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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the practice of therapeutic optometry; requiring an occupational certificate to perform certain surgical procedures. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 351.002(7), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (7) "Practice of therapeutic optometry" means using objective or subjective means, [not] including surgery, except as 8 prohibited by Section 351.4521 [or laser surgery], to: 9 (A) determine or measure the powers of vision of 10 11 the human eye as provided by Section 351.355; 12 (B) examine or diagnose visual defects, abnormal 13 conditions, or diseases of the human eye or adnexa; 14 (C) prescribe or fit lenses or prisms to correct or remedy a defect or abnormal condition of vision as provided by 15 Section 351.356; 16 (D) administer or prescribe a drug or physical 17 treatment in the manner authorized by this chapter; or 18 treat the visual system, including the eye or 19 (E) adnexa as authorized by this chapter. 20 21 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 351.151, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 22 23 Sec. 351.151. RULES; INTERPRETATION OF CHAPTER AND RULES. SECTION 3. Section 351.151, Occupations Code, is amended by 24

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1 adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:

(c) The board may provide an interpretation of a provision
of this chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter, including by
issuing an advisory opinion or declaratory ruling.

5 SECTION 4. Subchapter D, Chapter 351, Occupations Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 351.170 to read as follows:

Sec. 351.170. SOLE AUTHORITY OVER PRACTICE OF OPTOMETRY.
 The board has sole authority to regulate optometrists and
 therapeutic optometrists and to determine the scope of practice of
 an optometrist or therapeutic optometrist.

11 SECTION 5. Section 351.358, Occupations Code, is amended by 12 amending Subsections (b) and (c) and adding Subsection (f) to read 13 as follows:

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(b) A therapeutic optometrist may[+

[(1)] administer, perform, or prescribe ophthalmic devices, procedures, and appropriate medications administered by <u>any</u> [topical or oral] means[, in accordance with this section and <u>Section 351.3581,</u>] to diagnose or treat visual defects, abnormal conditions, or diseases of the human vision system, including the eye and adnexa[; or

21 [(2) administer medication by parenteral means for a
22 purpose and in a manner prescribed by Subsection (e)].

23 (c) A therapeutic optometrist may prescribe <u>not more than</u> 24 [oral medications only in the following classifications of oral 25 pharmaceuticals]:

26 (1) [one 10-day supply of oral antibiotics;
27 [(2) one 72-hour supply of oral antihistamines;

No. 2340 1 [(3) one seven-day supply of oral nonsteroidal 2 anti-inflammatories; 3 [(4)] one three-day supply of any medication classified as a controlled substance under Schedule [analgesic 4 5 identified in Schedules] III, IV, or [and] V of 21 U.S.C. Section 812; and 6 7 (2) one three-day supply of hydrocodone or a hydrocodone combination medication classified as a controlled 8 substance under Schedule II of 21 U.S.C. Section 812 [(5) any 9 10 other oral pharmaceutical recommended by the Optometric Health Care Advisory Committee and approved by the board and the Texas State 11 Board of Medical Examiners]. 12 (f) A therapeutic optometrist may administer, perform, 13 prescribe, or order diagnostic studies, analyses, tests, imaging 14 studies, or laboratory tests necessary to diagnose or treat visual 15 defects, abnormal conditions, or diseases of the human vision 16 17 system, including the eye and adnexa. SECTION 6. The heading to Section 351.3581, Occupations 18 Code, is amended to read as follows: 19 Sec. 351.3581. [DIACNOSIS AND] TREATMENT OF GLAUCOMA. 20 SECTION 7. Section 351.3581(a), Occupations Code, 21 is amended to read as follows: 22 23 (a) A therapeutic optometrist may not administer or prescribe an oral or parenteral medication or treat glaucoma unless 24 the therapeutic optometrist holds a certificate issued by the 25 board. A therapeutic optometrist certified under this section 26 [subsection] shall be known as an optometric glaucoma specialist. 27

No. 2340 1 To obtain a certificate, a therapeutic optometrist must [as required under Section 351.165(c)]: 2 3 (1) complete an instructional clinical review course; and 4 5 (2) pass an examination approved by the board. 6 SECTION 8. Subchapter H, Chapter 351, Occupations Code, is 7 amended by adding Section 351.3582 to read as follows: 8 Sec. 351.3582. CERTAIN SURGICAL PROCEDURES: CERTIFICATE REQUIRED. A therapeutic optometrist may not perform a surgical 9 procedure described by Section 351.4521(b) unless the therapeutic 10 optometrist holds a certificate issued by the board. To obtain a 11 12 certificate, a therapeutic optometrist must: (1) complete an instructional clinical review course; 13 14 and 15 (2) pass an examination approved by the board. SECTION 9. Section 351.4521, Occupations Code, is amended 16 17 to read as follows: Sec. 351.4521. PERFORMANCE OF CERTAIN SURGICAL PROCEDURES 18 BY THERAPEUTIC OPTOMETRISTS [SURGERY] 19 PROHIBITED. (a) А therapeutic optometrist may not perform the following surgical 20 procedures: 21 (1) retina<u>l laser procedures;</u> 22 (2) laser-assisted in situ keratomileusis (LASIK), 23 24 photorefractive keratectomy (PRK), or laser epithelial keratomileusis (LASEK); 25 26 (3) penetrating keratoplasty, corneal transplant, or lamellar keratoplasty; 27

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1	(4) a surgical procedure that requires the
2	administration of general anesthesia;
3	(5) intraocular injection;
4	(6) a surgical procedure relating to the removal of
5	the eye from a living person;
6	(7) surgical intraocular implants;
7	(8) surgery of the eyelid for a suspected eyelid
8	<pre>malignancy;</pre>
9	(9) tarsorrhaphy;
10	(10) surgery of the bony orbit, including orbital
11	implants; and
12	(11) retrobulbar injection or injection into the
13	extraocular orbital space.
14	(b) A therapeutic optometrist may not perform the following
15	surgical procedures unless the therapeutic optometrist holds a
16	certificate under Section 351.3582 and the procedure is performed
17	using laser or any form of ionizing or non-ionizing radiation:
18	(1) a surgical procedure requiring full-thickness
19	incision or excision of the cornea or sclera other than
20	paracentesis in an emergency situation requiring immediate
21	reduction of the pressure inside of the eye;
22	(2) a surgical procedure requiring incision or
23	excision of the iris and ciliary body;
24	(3) a surgical procedure requiring incision or
25	excision of the vitreous;
26	(4) a surgical procedure requiring incision or
27	excision of the retina;

1	(5) a surgical procedure requiring incision or
2	excision of the crystalline lens;
3	(6) a surgical procedure requiring incision or
4	excision of the extraocular muscles;
5	(7) the incisional or excisional repair of
6	blepharochalasis, dermatochalasis, or ptosis;
7	(8) a surgical procedure requiring incision or
8	excision of the lacrimal system other than lacrimal probing and
9	related procedures;
10	(9) a surgical procedure requiring conjunctivoplasty
11	with graft or flap; and
12	(10) a surgical procedure requiring incision or
13	excision of pterygium [surgery or laser surgery].
14	(c) This section does not:
15	(1) prevent a therapeutic optometrist from providing
16	preoperative or postoperative care relating to a surgical procedure
17	listed in Subsection (a) or (b); or
18	(2) limit the use of a diagnostic or therapeutic
19	instrument necessary to perform surgical treatments or procedures
20	to the eye or adnexa except for those treatments or procedures
21	specifically prohibited by this section.
22	SECTION 10. Not later than December 1, 2021, the Texas
23	Optometry Board shall adopt rules necessary to implement the
24	changes in law made by this Act to Chapter 351, Occupations Code.
25	SECTION 11. The following provisions of the Occupations
26	Code are repealed:
27	(1) Section 351.160;
