Section 48.110(f), Education Code, is amended to 5 read as follows: 6 7 (f) For purposes of this section, an annual graduate demonstrates: 8 (1) college readiness if the annual graduate: 9 achieves college readiness standards used 10 (A) for accountability purposes under Chapter 39 on the ACT, the SAT, or 11 12 an assessment instrument designated by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board under Section 51.334; and 13 14 (B) during a time period established by commissioner rule, enrolls at a postsecondary educational 15 16 institution; (2) career readiness if the annual graduate, during a 17 time period established by commissioner rule: 18 enrolls in a technical or vocational 19 (A) education program [achieves college readiness standards used for 20 accountability purposes under Chapter 39 on the ACT, the SAT, or an 21 assessment instrument designated by the Texas Higher Education 22 23 Coordinating Board under Section 51.334]; and 24 (B) [during a time period established

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commissioner rule, ] earns an industry-accepted certificate; and 1 (3) military readiness if the annual graduate: 2 achieves a passing 3 (A) score set by the 4 applicable military branch on the Armed Services Vocational 5 Aptitude Battery; and 6 (B) during a time period established by 7 commissioner rule, enlists in the armed forces of the United 8 States. SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022 9 10 school year. 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 14 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
