- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 504.002(a), Transportation Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (1) except for license plates specified as exempt, the
- 8 fee for issuance of a license plate, including replacement plates,
- 9 is in addition to each other fee that is paid for at the time of the
- 10 registration of the motor vehicle and shall be deposited to the
- 11 credit of the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles fund;
- 12 (2) if the registration period is greater than 12
- 13 months, the expiration date of a specialty license plate, symbol,
- 14 tab, or other device shall be aligned with the registration period,
- 15 and the specialty plate fee shall be adjusted pro rata, except that
- 16 if the statutory annual fee for a specialty license plate is \$5 or
- 17 less, it may not be prorated;
- 18 (3) the department is the exclusive owner of the
- 19 design of each license plate;
- 20 (4) if a license plate is lost, stolen, or mutilated,
- 21 an application for a replacement plate must be accompanied by the
- 22 fee prescribed by Section 502.060; and
- 23 (5) the department shall prepare the designs and
- 24 specifications of license plates+; and

- 1 (6) the department shall allow a vehicle registered
- 2 under Chapter 502 to be equipped with a license plate that utilizes
- 3 <u>integrated circuit technology.</u>
- 4 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
