## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the use of weighted lotteries for student admission to
3	public schools or for student transfers within a school district.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 12.117, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
7	(a-1) An open-enrollment charter school that fills
8	available positions by lottery under Subsection (a)(2)(A) may use a
9	weighted lottery that assigns weights to applicants so that an
10	applicant's probability of admission increases if the applicant is:
11	(1) eligible to participate in the school's special
12	education program under Section 29.003;
13	(2) a student of limited English proficiency, as
14	defined by Section 29.052; or
15	(3) educationally disadvantaged.
16	SECTION 2. Section 25.001, Education Code, is amended by
17	adding Subsection (k) to read as follows:
18	(k) If a school district elects to admit students not
19	described by Subsection (b) into the district's schools by lottery,
20	the district may use a weighted lottery that assigns weights to
21	applicants so that an applicant's probability of admission
22	increases if the applicant is:
23	(1) eligible to participate in the school's special

education program under Section 29.003;

- 1 (2) a student of limited English proficiency, as
- 2 defined by Section 29.052; or
- 3 (3) <u>educationally disadvantaged.</u>
- 4 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 25, Education Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Section 25.0311 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 25.0311. TRANSFER WITHIN DISTRICT BY LOTTERY. If the
- 7 board of trustees of a school district elects to allow a student
- 8 enrolled in the district to transfer from the student's assigned
- 9 campus to another campus in the district by lottery, the board may
- 10 use a weighted lottery that assigns weights to applicants so that an
- 11 applicant's probability of receiving the transfer increases if the
- 12 applicant is:
- (1) eligible to participate in the school's special
- 14 education program under Section 29.003;
- 15 (2) a student of limited English proficiency, as
- 16 <u>defined by Section 29.052; or</u>
- 17 (3) educationally disadvantaged.
- SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
- 19 school year.
- 20 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
