A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to State Bar of Texas elections.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 81.019, Government Code, is amended by
- 5 amending Subsections (b) and (c) and adding Subsection (d) to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 (b) Except as provided by <u>Subsections</u> [Subsection] (c) <u>and</u>
- 8 (d), the officers shall be elected in accordance with rules for the
- 9 election of officers and directors prepared and proposed by the
- 10 supreme court as provided by Section 81.024.
- 11 (c) The election rules must permit any member's name to be
- 12 printed on the ballot as a candidate for president-elect if a
- 13 written petition requesting that action and signed by at least 500
- 14 active members [five percent of the membership] of the state bar is
- 15 filed with the executive director at least 30 days before the
- 16 election ballots are to be distributed to the membership.
- 17 (d) The election rules must permit electronic signatures on
- 18 a written petition submitted as provided by Subsection (c).
- 19 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 81, Government Code, is
- 20 amended by adding Section 81.0243 to read as follows:
- Sec. 81.0243. VOTING DISCRIMINATION PROHIBITED; INJUNCTIVE
- 22 RELIEF. (a) Voting discrimination based on religion, age, sex,
- 23 race, color, creed, or national origin is prohibited in any form by
- 24 members of the state bar in elections under this chapter.

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- 1 (b) A person may bring an action for injunctive relief
- 2 against a member of the state bar who appears to be violating or is
- 3 threatening to violate Subsection (a). Venue for the action is a
- 4 district court in Travis County. The person may recover reasonable
- 5 <u>expenses incurred in obtaining injunctive relief</u>, including court
- 6 costs and attorney's fees.
- 7 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 8 of this Act, the Texas Supreme Court shall adopt the rules necessary
- 9 to implement the changes in law made by this Act.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
