A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the computation of unemployment compensation benefits

- 3 for an individual who is totally unemployed in a benefit period.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 207.002(a), (b), and (c-1), Labor Code,
- 6 are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) An eligible individual who is totally unemployed in a
- 8 benefit period is entitled to benefits for the benefit period at the
- 9 rate of 2/43 [1/25] of the wages received by the individual from
- 10 employment by employers during that quarter in the individual's
- 11 base period in which wages were highest. For purposes of this
- 12 subsection, the wages received by the individual from employment by
- 13 employers during the individual's base period include wages ordered
- 14 to be paid to the individual by a final order of the commission
- 15 under Chapter 61 that:
- 16 (1) were due to be paid to the individual by an
- 17 employer during the individual's base period; and
- 18 (2) will be credited to the date or dates on which the
- 19 payment of those wages was due.
- 20 (b) The maximum weekly benefit amount is 60 [47.6] percent
- 21 of the average weekly wage in covered employment in this state. The
- 22 minimum weekly benefit amount is 15 (7.6) percent of the average
- 23 weekly wage in covered employment in this state.
- 24 (c-1) An increase in the maximum weekly benefit amount may

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- 1 not exceed \$14 in any year. An increase in the minimum weekly
- 2 benefit amount may not exceed \$1 in any year. The limitations
- 3 prescribed by this subsection apply only to an increase that is
- 4 caused solely by an increase in the average weekly wage in covered
- 5 employment in this state.
- 6 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 7 a claim for unemployment compensation benefits filed with the Texas
- 8 Workforce Commission on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 9 claim filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the
- 10 law in effect on the date the claim was filed, and the former law is
- 11 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect October 1, 2021.
