- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 351.10692, Tax Code, is amended by
- amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (e) to read 6
- as follows: 7

- (a) This section applies only to a municipality that is 8
- [with a population of less than 2,000] located in a county that: 9
- (1) is adjacent to the county in which the State 10
- 11 Capitol is located; and
- 12 (2) contains [has a population of]:
- 13 (A) a headquarters and visitor center for a
- 14 national historical park dedicated to a former president of the
- United States [not more than 25,000]; or 15
- 16 more than one area that is certified as a Dark
- Sky Community by the International Dark-Sky Association as part of 17
- the International Dark Sky Places Program [at least 100,000 but not 18
- more than 200,000]. 19
- A municipality that uses revenue from the municipal 20
- 21 hotel occupancy tax for a purpose described by Subsection (b):
- 22 shall make a good-faith estimate based on
- 23 reasonable documentation of [determine] the annual amount of area
- hotel revenue attributable to dark skies related events and 24

- 1 activities [for five years after the date the municipality first
- 2 uses hotel occupancy tax revenue for a purpose described by
- 3 Subsection (b)]; and
- 4 (2) may not spend municipal hotel occupancy tax
- 5 revenue for the purposes described by Subsection (b) in an annual [a
- 6 total] amount that exceeds the amount determined under Subdivision
- 7 (1).
- 8 (e) A municipality that uses municipal hotel occupancy tax
- 9 revenue under this section may not reduce the percentage of revenue
- 10 from that tax allocated for a purpose described by Section
- 11 351.101(a)(3) to a percentage that is less than the average
- 12 percentage of the revenue from that tax allocated by the
- 13 municipality for the purpose described by Section 351.101(a)(3)
- 14 during the 36-month period preceding the date the municipality
- 15 begins using revenue for a purpose described by this section.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
