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State Board of Education shall consult with interested parties and 1 may create a work group of volunteers to make recommendations 2 3 regarding the curriculum. 4 (d) Before finalizing the curriculum developed under this 5 section, the State Board of Education shall provide a reasonable period for public comment. 6 7 (e) Subject to rules adopted by the State Board of 8 Education, a school district or open-enrollment charter school may tailor the curriculum developed under this section as appropriate 9 for the district's or school's community. In tailoring the 10 instruction, the district or school shall solicit input from the 11 State Board of Education, the agency, community members, and other 12 interested individuals or organizations. 13 14 SECTION 3.
