## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to the election of emergency services commissioners in 3 certain emergency services districts.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Sections 775.0345(b-1), (d-1), (e), and (h-1),
6 Health and Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

7 (b-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), the governing body of a district described by Subsection (a)(2) [or (3)] is governed by a 8 five-member board of emergency services commissioners elected from 9 single-member districts. One director is elected from each 10 11 single-member district. As soon as possible after the district is 12 created, the commissioners court of the county in which the district is located shall divide the district into five numbered 13 14 single-member districts.

15 (d-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (d), to be eligible to be a 16 candidate for emergency services commissioner in a single-member 17 district on an initial board in a district described by Subsection 18 (a)(2) [<del>or (3)</del>], a person must be at least 18 years of age and a 19 resident of that single-member district.

(e) A candidate for emergency services commissioner on an initial board must give the voter registrar of the county a sworn notice of the candidate's intention to run for office. The notice must state the person's name, age, and address and state that the person is serving notice of intent to run for emergency services

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1 commissioner. If the person intends to run for emergency services 2 commissioner in a single-member district in a district described by 3 Subsection (a)(2) [or (3)], the notice must also specify the 4 single-member district the person seeks to represent. On receipt 5 of the notice, the voter registrar of the county shall have the 6 candidate's name placed on the ballot.

7 (h-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (h), the five initial 8 emergency services commissioners elected from single-member districts in a district described by Subsection (a)(2) [or (3)] 9 shall draw lots to determine which two commissioners serve terms 10 that expire on December 31 of the second year following the year in 11 which the election was held and which three commissioners serve 12 terms that expire on December 31 of the fourth year following the 13 14 year in which the election was held.

15 SECTION 2. (a) This Act does not prohibit a person who is 16 serving as an emergency services commissioner on the effective date 17 of this Act from running for election to the board of commissioners 18 after the effective date of this Act if the person has the 19 qualifications required for a member under Section 775.0345, Health 20 and Safety Code.

(b) The terms of the emergency services commissioners serving on the effective date of this Act expire on the date a majority of the new emergency services commissioners elected under Subsection (c) of this section qualify to serve.

(c) The county judge of a county with an emergency services
district to which Section 775.0345(a)(3), Health and Safety Code,
applies on the effective date of this Act shall establish an

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1 election to elect new emergency services commissioners of that 2 district in the manner provided by Section 775.0345, Health and 3 Safety Code, as amended by this Act, for election of the initial 4 commissioners as if the district had been created on the effective 5 date of this Act.

6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
