A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to step therapy protocols required by health benefit plans
- 3 for coverage of prescription drugs for serious mental illnesses.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 1369, Insurance Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 1369.0547 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1369.0547. STEP THERAPY PROTOCOLS FOR PRESCRIPTION
- 8 DRUGS TO TREAT SERIOUS MENTAL ILLNESSES. (a) In this section,
- 9 "serious mental illness" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 10 <u>1355</u>.001.
- 11 (b) This section applies only to a drug prescribed to an
- 12 enrollee who is 18 years of age or older to treat a diagnosis of a
- 13 serious mental illness.
- 14 (c) A health benefit plan that provides coverage for
- 15 prescription drugs to treat a serious mental illness may not
- 16 require, before the health benefit plan provides coverage of a
- 17 prescription drug approved by the United States Food and Drug
- 18 Administration, that the enrollee:
- (1) fail to successfully respond to more than one
- 20 different drug for each drug prescribed, excluding the generic or
- 21 brand name equivalent of the prescribed drug; or
- 22 (2) prove a history of failure of more than one
- 23 different drug for each drug prescribed, excluding the generic or
- 24 brand name equivalent of the prescribed drug.

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- 1 (d) Subject to Section 1369.0546, a health benefit plan
- 2 issuer may implement a step therapy protocol to require a trial of a
- 3 generic or brand name equivalent of a prescribed prescription drug
- 4 as a condition of continued coverage of the prescribed drug only:
- 5 (1) once in a plan year; and
- 6 (2) if the equivalent drug is added to the plan's drug
- 7 formulary.
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act applies only to a health benefit plan
- 9 delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed on or after January 1,
- 10 2022. A health benefit plan delivered, issued for delivery, or
- 11 renewed before January 1, 2022, is governed by the law as it existed
- 12 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is
- 13 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
