- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. TASK FORCE. (a) In this section:
- 6 (1) "Disability" means, with respect to an individual,
- 7 a mental or physical impairment that substantially limits at least
- 8 one major life activity of that individual.
- 9 (2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
- 10 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
- 11 (3) "Task force" means the task force established by
- 12 this section.
- 13 (b) The executive commissioner shall establish a task force
- 14 to study access to legal services for persons with disabilities.
- 15 (c) The task force shall be composed of seven members as
- 16 follows:
- 17 (1) five members appointed by the executive
- 18 commissioner, including:
- 19 (A) at least two members who are adults with
- 20 disabilities; and
- 21 (B) at least two members who are parents of
- 22 children with disabilities; and
- 23 (2) two members who represent Disability Rights Texas.
- 24 (d) The executive commissioner shall designate a member as

- 1 the presiding officer of the task force.
- 2 (e) The task force shall meet at least quarterly at the call
- 3 of the presiding officer and at other times determined by the
- 4 presiding officer.
- 5 (f) The task force shall study access to legal services for
- 6 persons with disabilities. The study must examine and make
- 7 recommendations regarding:
- 8 (1) the availability of legal representation for
- 9 persons with disabilities;
- 10 (2) the availability of advocacy and legal services
- 11 for persons with disabilities; and
- 12 (3) the barriers to accessing legal services for
- 13 persons with disabilities, including communication, financial,
- 14 medical, and cognitive barriers.
- 15 (g) The task force shall develop and submit a written report
- 16 of the study and recommendations developed by the task force to the
- 17 Health and Human Services Commission, the governor, the lieutenant
- 18 governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and each
- 19 member of the legislature not later than December 1, 2022.
- 20 (h) The task force may develop instructional and training
- 21 materials for legal professionals and persons with disabilities
- 22 relating to legal issues affecting persons with disabilities.
- 23 (i) The task force may partner with or seek and accept
- 24 assistance from voluntary organizations active in supporting
- 25 persons with disabilities.
- 26 (j) The task force is abolished and this Act expires June 1,
- 27 2023.

- 1 SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 2 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 3 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 4 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 5 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
