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relating to matters regarding educators, including the composition of the State Board for Educator Certification, the issuance of certain sanctions by the board, and requiring a school district to notify a teacher regarding the submission of certain complaints to the board.

- 21 21.210(e) and (f), Education Code, as added by this Act, apply only
- 22 to a disciplinary proceeding initiated by the State Board for
- 23 Educator Certification on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 24 A disciplinary proceeding commenced before the effective date of
- 25 this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before that
- 26 date, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
