- 2 (g-2) Members of the governing body of an independent organization certified under this section serve staggered terms of 3 two years, with seven members' terms expiring February 1 of each 4 odd-numbered year and eight members' terms expiring February 1 of 5 each even-numbered year. Not later than the 30th day after the date 6 7 a member of the governing body's term expires, the appropriate 8 appointing authority shall appoint a replacement in the same manner as the original appointment. If a vacancy occurs on the governing 9 body, the appropriate appointing authority shall appoint a 10 successor in the same manner as the original appointment to serve 11 for the remainder of the unexpired term. The appropriate 12 appointing authority shall appoint the successor not later than the 13 14 30th day after the date the vacancy occurs.
- 15 <u>(g-3)</u> To qualify for appointment as a member of the 16 governing body under Subsection (g), a person must be a resident of 17 this state.
- 18 <u>(g-4) To maintain certification as an independent</u>

- Not later than December 1, 2021, the 21 SECTION 2. (a) governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of 22 representatives shall comply with Section 39.151, Utilities Code, 23 24 as amended by this Act, by appointing members to the governing body of an independent organization certified under Section 39.151, 25 Utilities Code, by the Public Utility Commission of Texas before 26 27 September 1, 2021. - 10 (c) After September 1, 2022, the Public Utility Commission

- 12 body or chief executive officer does not comply with Section
- 13 39.151, Utilities Code, as amended by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
