A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to crime scene investigation services; authorizing fees.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Article 38.01, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
5	amended by adding Section 4-e to read as follows:
6	Sec. 4-e. CRIME SCENE INVESTIGATOR CERTIFICATION. (a) The
7	commission by rule shall:
8	(1) establish the qualifications for a certification
9	that include:
10	(A) successful completion of the education
11	requirements established by the commission;
12	(B) specific coursework and experience; and
13	(C) successful completion of an examination
14	required or recognized by the commission;
15	(2) set fees for the issuance and renewal of a
16	certification; and
17	(3) establish the term of a crime scene investigator
18	certification.
19	(b) The commission by rule may recognize a certification
20	issued by a national organization specializing in crime scene
21	investigation as satisfying the requirements established under
22	Subsection (a) to the extent the commission determines the content
23	required to receive the certification is substantially equivalent
24	to the content of the requirements under that subsection.

- 1 (c) The commission shall issue a certification to an
- 2 applicant who:
- 3 (1) submits an application on a form prescribed by the
- 4 commission;
- 5 (2) meets the qualifications established by
- 6 commission rule; and
- 7 (3) pays the required fee.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 252.022, Local Government Code, is
- 9 amended by adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 10 (e) This chapter does not apply to an expenditure for crime
- 11 scene investigation services conducted by a law enforcement agency,
- 12 crime laboratory, or medical examiner's office if the law
- 13 enforcement agency, crime laboratory, or medical examiner's
- 14 office:
- 15 (1) is accredited under Section 4-d, Article 38.01,
- 16 Code of Criminal Procedure; or
- 17 <u>(2) employs:</u>
- 18 (A) more than 10 crime scene investigators and at
- 19 least 20 percent of the crime scene investigators are certified
- 20 under Section 4-e, Article 38.01, Code of Criminal Procedure; or
- 21 (B) 10 crime scene investigators or fewer and at
- 22 <u>least one of the crime scene investigators is certified under</u>
- 23 <u>Section 4-e, Article 38.01, Code of Criminal Procedure.</u>
- SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 262, Local Government
- 25 Code, is amended by adding Section 262.0242 to read as follows:
- Sec. 262.0242. MANDATORY EXEMPTION: CRIME SCENE
- 27 INVESTIGATION SERVICES. Section 262.023 does not apply to the

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- 1 purchase of crime scene investigation services conducted by a law
- 2 enforcement agency, crime laboratory, or medical examiner's office
- 3 if the law enforcement agency, crime laboratory, or medical
- 4 examiner's office:
- 5 (1) is accredited under Section 4-d, Article 38.01,
- 6 Code of Criminal Procedure; or
- 7 <u>(2) employs:</u>
- 8 (A) more than 10 crime scene investigators and at
- 9 least 20 percent of the crime scene investigators are certified
- 10 under Section 4-e, Article 38.01, Code of Criminal Procedure; or
- 11 (B) 10 crime scene investigators or fewer and at
- 12 least one of the crime scene investigators is certified under
- 13 Section 4-e, Article 38.01, Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 14 SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 15 of this Act, the Texas Forensic Science Commission shall adopt the
- 16 rules necessary to implement Section 4-e, Article 38.01, Code of
- 17 Criminal Procedure, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
