A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the determination of whether a person is intoxicated for purposes of the Texas Workers' Compensation Act. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 401.013, Labor Code, is amended by 5 amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (d) to read 6 as follows: 7 (a) In this subtitle, "intoxication" means the state of: 8 9 (1) having an alcohol concentration to qualify as intoxicated under Section 49.01(2), Penal Code; or 10 11 (2) not having the normal use of mental or physical 12 faculties by reason of [resulting from] the [voluntary] introduction into the body of: 13 14 (A) an alcoholic beverage, as defined by Section 1.04, Alcoholic Beverage Code; 15 (B) a controlled substance or controlled 16 substance analogue, as defined by Section 481.002, Health and 17 Safety Code; 18 (C) a dangerous drug, as defined by Section 19 483.001, Health and Safety Code; 20 an abusable volatile chemical [glue or 21 (D) 22 aerosol paint], as defined by Section 485.001, Health and Safety 23 Code; or any similar substance, the use of which is 24 (E)

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1 regulated under state law.

(c) <u>An analysis of a specimen of blood, urine, or any bodily</u>
<u>fluid collected during an autopsy that shows the presence</u> [On the
<u>voluntary introduction into the body</u>] of any substance listed under
Subsection <u>(a)(2) creates</u> [(a)(2)(B), based on a blood test or
<u>urinalysis, it is</u>] a rebuttable presumption that a person <u>was</u> [is]
intoxicated and <u>did</u> [does] not have the normal use of mental or
physical faculties.

9 <u>(d) The presumption under Subsection (c) may be rebutted</u> 10 <u>only by credible and objective evidence that the person was not</u> 11 <u>intoxicated.</u>

12 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 13 to a claim for workers' compensation benefits based on a 14 compensable injury that occurs on or after the effective date of 15 this Act. A claim based on a compensable injury that occurs before 16 that date is governed by the law as it existed on the date the 17 compensable injury occurred, and the former law is continued in 18 effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
