H.B. No. 2689

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of the Climate Change Impact Assessment 3 Council. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. (a) In this section, "council" means the Climate 6 Change Impact Assessment Council. 7 (b) The council is established to study the impact of climate change on the health, safety, and welfare of the residents 8 of this state. 9 (c) The council is composed of the following members: 10 11 (1) two members of the senate appointed by the 12 lieutenant governor; 13 (2) two members of the house of representatives 14 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; and (3) seven members of the public appointed jointly by 15 lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of 16 the representatives, including: 17 18 (A) one member with expertise in climatology; (B) one member with expertise in this state's 19 20 economy; 21 (C) one member with expertise in land management and natural resource maintenance; and 22 23 (D) one member representing the tourism 24 industry.

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1 (d) A public member of the council is entitled to 2 reimbursement of the travel expenses incurred by the member while 3 conducting the business of the council, as provided by the General 4 Appropriations Act.

5 (e) The House Committee on Environmental Regulation and the 6 Senate Committee on Natural Resources and Economic Development 7 shall provide personnel and administrative support to the council 8 as needed.

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(f) The council shall conduct a study to:

10 (1) assess the current and potential effects of 11 climate change trends on the residents, natural resources, public 12 health, and economy of this state;

13 (2) estimate the costs to this state of adverse
14 effects associated with climate change;

15 (3) research measures for preventing or mitigating the 16 effects of flooding, erosion, drought, and wildfires that may be 17 caused or worsened by climate change; and

18 (4) recommend legislation or other regulations to19 minimize the adverse impact of climate change on this state.

(g) The council shall hold public hearings in various partsof this state to gather information related to the council's study.

(h) Not later than January 1, 2023, the council shall prepare and submit a report to the legislature containing the findings of the study described in Subsection (f).

(i) The council is abolished and this Act expires September1, 2023.

27 SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2021, the lieutenant

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1 governor and the speaker of the house of representatives shall 2 appoint members to the Climate Change Impact Assessment Council as 3 required by this Act.

4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
