A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to in-person visitation of an immediate family member or
3	religious counsel with seriously ill or dying hospital patients and
4	facility residents.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 241, Health and Safety
7	Code, is amended by adding Section 241.012 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 241.012. IN-PERSON VISITATION OF IMMEDIATE FAMILY
9	MEMBER OR RELIGIOUS COUNSEL. (a) In this section:
10	(1) "Immediate family member" means an individual who
11	is related to a person within the second degree by affinity or
12	consanguinity, as determined under Chapter 573, Government Code.
13	(2) "Religious counsel" means an individual acting
14	substantially in a pastoral or religious capacity to counsel other
15	<u>individuals.</u>
16	(b) A hospital may not prohibit in-person visitation,
17	including visitation during a state of disaster declared under
18	Chapter 418, Government Code, of the following individuals with a
19	patient at the hospital who is seriously ill or dying:
20	(1) an immediate family member of the patient; or
21	(2) religious counsel.
22	(c) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), a hospital may require
23	the immediate family member or religious counsel to:
24	(1) submit to a health screening administered by the

- 2 (2) wear personal protective equipment at all times
- 3 while visiting a patient at the hospital.
- 4 (d) In the event of a conflict between this section and any
- 5 other law, this section prevails.
- 6 SECTION 2. Subchapter L, Chapter 242, Health and Safety
- 7 Code, is amended by adding Section 242.506 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 242.506. IN-PERSON VISITATION OF IMMEDIATE FAMILY
- 9 MEMBER OR RELIGIOUS COUNSEL. (a) In this section:
- 10 (1) "Immediate family member" means an individual who
- 11 is related to a person within the second degree by affinity or
- 12 consanguinity, as determined under Chapter 573, Government Code.
- 13 (2) "Religious counsel" means an individual acting
- 14 substantially in a pastoral or religious capacity to counsel other
- 15 individuals.
- 16 (b) A facility may not prohibit in-person visitation,
- 17 including visitation during a state of disaster declared under
- 18 Chapter 418, Government Code, of the following individuals with a
- 19 resident of the facility who is seriously ill or dying:
- 20 (1) an immediate family member of the patient; or
- 21 (2) religious counsel.
- (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), a facility may require
- 23 the immediate family member or religious counsel to:
- 24 (1) submit to a health screening administered by the
- 25 <u>facility</u>; and
- 26 (2) wear personal protective equipment at all times
- 27 while visiting a resident at the facility.

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- 1 (d) In the event of a conflict between this section and any
- 2 other law, this section prevails.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
