4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 5, Business & Commerce Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 113 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 113. PRICING OF FRUITS AND VEGETABLES DURING DECLARED
8	DISASTER
9	Sec. 113.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Declared disaster" means:
11	(A) a disaster declared by the president of the
12	United States, if any part of this state is named in the federally
13	designated disaster area;
14	(B) a state of disaster declared by the governor
15	under Section 418.014, Government Code; or
16	(C) a local state of disaster declared by the
17	presiding officer of the governing body of a political subdivision
18	under Section 418.108, Government Code.
19	(2) "Declared disaster period" means the period during
20	which an area of this state is subject to:
21	(A) a declaration of a state of disaster under
22	Section 418.014 or 418.108, Government Code; or
23	(B) a declaration of the disaster by the
24	president of the United States described by Subdivision (1)(A)

- 1 (3) "Fruit or vegetable" includes any variety of
- 2 fresh, canned, dried, or frozen whole or cut fruits or vegetables.
- 3 Sec. 113.002. PRICES CONSIDERED EXORBITANT OR EXCESSIVE.
- 4 For purposes of this chapter, the price of a fruit or vegetable is
- 5 considered exorbitant or excessive if the price, when compared with
- 6 the price of the fruit or vegetable on the seventh day before a
- 7 declared disaster begins, has increased by 100 percent.
- 8 Sec. 113.003. EXORBITANT OR EXCESSIVE PRICES PROHIBITED
- 9 DURING DECLARED DISASTER PERIOD; OFFENSE. (a) A merchant may not,
- 10 in any area of this state subject to the disaster declaration, take
- 11 any of the following actions during a declared disaster period with
- 12 the intent to take advantage of the disaster:
- 13 <u>(1) sell a fruit or vegetable at an exorbitant or</u>
- 14 excessive price; or
- 15 (2) demand an exorbitant or excessive price for a
- 16 <u>fruit or vegetable.</u>
- 17 (b) A merchant who violates this section commits an offense.
- 18 Each day a violation continues constitutes a separate offense.
- 19 (c) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
- 20 (d) A violation of this chapter constitutes a separate
- 21 violation from any violation of Section 17.46(b)(27).
- 22 SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- 23 only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this
- 24 Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before
- 25 the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs
- 26 before the effective date.
- 27 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this

- 1 Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was
- 2 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 3 purpose.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
