4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 38, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
6	amended by adding Article 38.372 to read as follows:
7	Art. 38.372. EVIDENCE IN PROSECUTION OF TRAFFICKING OR
8	SEXUAL OFFENSE. (a) This article applies to a proceeding in the
9	prosecution of a defendant for an offense, or for an attempt or
10	conspiracy to commit an offense, under any of the following
11	provisions of the Penal Code:
12	(1) Chapter 20A (Trafficking of Persons);
13	(2) Section 22.011 (Sexual Assault);
14	(3) Section 22.021 (Aggravated Sexual Assault);
15	(4) Section 43.03 (Promotion of Prostitution);
16	(5) Section 43.031 (Online Promotion of
17	<pre>Prostitution);</pre>
18	(6) Section 43.04 (Aggravated Promotion of
19	<pre>Prostitution);</pre>
20	(7) Section 43.041 (Aggravated Online Promotion of
21	Prostitution); or
22	(8) Section 43.05 (Compelling Prostitution).
23	(b) In the prosecution of an offense described by Subsection
24	(a), subject to the Texas Rules of Evidence or other applicable law,

- 1 each party may offer testimony or other evidence of all relevant
- 2 facts and circumstances that would assist the trier of fact in
- 3 determining whether the actor committed the offense described by
- 4 Subsection (a), including testimony or evidence regarding the
- 5 nature of the relationship between the actor and the alleged
- 6 victim.
- 7 (c) This article does not permit the presentation of
- 8 character evidence that would otherwise be inadmissible under the
- 9 Texas Rules of Evidence or other applicable law.
- 10 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to a
- 11 criminal proceeding that commences on or after the effective date
- 12 of this Act. A criminal proceeding that commences before the
- 13 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the
- 14 proceeding commenced, and the former law is continued in effect for
- 15 that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
