## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the liability of certain volunteers who provide
3	veterinary care or treatment and certain confidential or privileged
4	information related to veterinary care or treatment.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Title 4, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 91B to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 91B. LIABILITY OF VOLUNTEER VETERINARY PRACTITIONERS
9	Sec. 91B.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter, "certified
10	veterinary assistant," "licensed veterinary technician," and
11	"veterinarian" have the meanings assigned by Section 801.002,
12	Occupations Code.
13	Sec. 91B.002. IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY. (a) Except as
14	provided by Section 91B.003, a certified veterinary assistant,
15	licensed veterinary technician, or veterinarian who in good faith
16	and as a volunteer provides veterinary care or treatment to an
17	injured animal is immune from civil liability for an act or omission
18	that occurs in providing that care or treatment if the care or
19	<pre>treatment is provided:</pre>
20	(1) in response to an incident that is a man-made or
21	natural disaster that injures, endangers, or threatens to endanger

the animal;

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authorized representative of a local, state, or federal agency,

(2) at the request of the owner of the animal or an

- 1 including a fire department, a police department, an emergency
- 2 management agency, or a disaster response agency; and
- 3 (3) within the scope of practice authorized and level
- 4 of supervision required under Chapter 801, Occupations Code.
- 5 (b) This section does not apply to a certified veterinary
- 6 assistant, licensed veterinary technician, or veterinarian giving
- 7 veterinary care or treatment for or in expectation of compensation
- 8 from or on behalf of the owner of the animal in excess of
- 9 reimbursement for expenses incurred.
- Sec. 91B.003. APPLICABILITY. This chapter does not apply
- 11 to an act or omission that is grossly negligent or intentional
- 12 misconduct.
- SECTION 2. Section 801.353, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 14 adding Subsections (d-2) and (f-1) and amending Subsection (g) to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 (d-2) The privilege provided by this section is waived by
- 17 the client or the owner of the animal treated by the veterinarian
- 18 with respect to information regarding the animal's care and
- 19 treatment by the veterinarian that the client or owner publishes in
- 20 a public forum if:
- 21 (1) the information shared by the client or owner in
- 22 the public forum is false with respect to the veterinarian;
- (2) any information shared by the veterinarian in
- 24 response is limited to factual information of which the
- 25 <u>veterinarian</u> has knowledge that directly refutes the false
- 26 information shared by the client or owner in the public forum; and
- 27 (3) the veterinarian does not share any personally

- 1 identifiable information of a client or owner other than the full
- 2 <u>name of the client or owner.</u>
- 3 (f-1) A veterinarian does not violate this section by
- 4 providing to a veterinarian or an appropriate governmental entity
- 5 information regarding:
- (1) the prescribing, dispensing, or requesting of a
- 7 <u>controlled substance; or</u>
- 8 (2) cruelty to or an attack of an animal.
- 9 (g) A public health authority or other governmental entity
- 10 that receives information under Subsection (f) or (f-1) shall
- 11 maintain the confidentiality of the information, may not disclose
- 12 the information under Chapter 552, Government Code, and may not use
- 13 the information for a purpose that does not directly relate to law
- 14 <u>enforcement or</u> the protection of public health and safety.
- 15 SECTION 3. Chapter 91B, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
- 16 as added by this Act, does not apply to a cause of action that
- 17 accrued before the effective date of this Act. A cause of action
- 18 that accrued before the effective date of this Act is governed by
- 19 the law applicable to the cause of action immediately before the
- 20 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for
- 21 that purpose.
- SECTION 4. Section 801.353, Occupations Code, as amended by
- 23 this Act, applies only to the disclosure or release of information
- 24 under that section on or after the effective date of this Act. The
- 25 disclosure or release of information before that date is governed
- 26 by the law in effect on the date of the disclosure or release, and
- 27 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

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1 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
