- 2 relating to criminal penalties for performing certain abortions;
- 3 creating criminal offenses.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 170, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Section 170.003 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 170.003. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) A person who violates
- 8 Section 170.002(a) commits an offense.
- 9 (b) An offense under this section is a felony of the second
- 10 degree, except that the offense is a felony of the first degree if
- 11 the person has previously been convicted of an offense under this
- 12 <u>section or under Section 171.049, 171.103, or 171.153.</u>
- 13 (c) If conduct constituting an offense under this section
- 14 also constitutes an offense under another section of this code or
- 15 the Penal Code, the actor may be prosecuted under this section or
- 16 under both sections.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 171, Health and Safety
- 18 Code, is amended by adding Section 171.049 to read as follows:
- Sec. 171.049. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) A person who violates
- 20 <u>Section 171.043 or 171.044 commits an offense.</u>
- 21 (b) An offense under this section is a felony of the second
- 22 degree, except that the offense is a felony of the first degree if
- 23 the person has previously been convicted of an offense under this
- 24 section or under Section 170.003, 171.103, or 171.153.

- 1 (c) If conduct constituting an offense under this section
- 2 also constitutes an offense under another section of this code or
- 3 the Penal Code, the actor may be prosecuted under this section or
- 4 under both sections.
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 171.103, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 171.103. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) A person who violates
- 8 Section 171.102 commits an offense.
- 9 (b) An offense under this section is a felony of the second
- 10 degree, except that the offense is a felony of the first degree if
- 11 the person has previously been convicted of an offense under this
- 12 section or under Section 170.003, 171.049, or 171.153 [state jail
- 13 felony].
- 14 (c) If conduct constituting an offense under this section
- 15 also constitutes an offense under another section of this code or
- 16 the Penal Code, the actor may be prosecuted under this section or
- 17 under both sections.
- SECTION 4. Section 171.153, Health and Safety Code, is
- 19 amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to
- 20 read as follows:
- 21 (b) An offense under this section is a <u>felony of the second</u>
- 22 degree, except that the offense is a felony of the first degree if
- 23 the person has previously been convicted of an offense under this
- 24 <u>section or under Section 170.003, 171.049, or 171.103</u> [state jail
- 25 felony].
- 26 (c) If conduct constituting an offense under this section
- 27 also constitutes an offense under another section of this code or

- 1 the Penal Code, the actor may be prosecuted under this section or
- 2 under both sections.
- 3 SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 4 an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 5 offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 6 by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former
- 7 law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this
- 8 section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this
- 9 Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.
- 10 SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 11 an abortion performed, induced, or attempted on or after the
- 12 effective date of this Act. An abortion performed, induced, or
- 13 attempted before the effective date of this Act is governed by the
- 14 law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
- 15 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
