- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 37.0021, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (j) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (d) <u>Subject to Subsection (j)</u>, the [<del>The</del>] commissioner by
- 10 rule shall adopt procedures for the use of restraint and time-out by
- 11 a school district employee or volunteer or an independent
- 12 contractor of a district in the case of a student with a disability
- 13 receiving special education services under Subchapter A, Chapter
- 14 29. A procedure adopted under this subsection must:
- 15 (1) be consistent with:
- 16 (A) professionally accepted practices and
- 17 standards of student discipline and techniques for behavior
- 18 management; and
- 19 (B) relevant health and safety standards; and
- 20 (2) identify any discipline management practice or
- 21 behavior management technique that requires a district employee or
- 22 volunteer or an independent contractor of a district to be trained
- 23 before using that practice or technique.
- 24 (j) A peace officer performing law enforcement duties or

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- 1 school security personnel performing security-related duties on
- 2 school property or at a school-sponsored or school-related activity
- 3 may not restrain a student 10 years of age or younger unless the
- 4 student poses a serious risk of harm to the student or another
- 5 person.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
