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1 (e) A municipality to which this section applies is not 2 entitled to receive revenue under Subsection (d) unless the 3 municipality commences a qualified project under this subchapter 4 before September 1, <u>2027</u> [<del>2023</del>].

5 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
