- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 264.1076, Family Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsections (b) and (i) and adding Subsection (b-1) to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (b) The department shall ensure that each child described by
- 10 Subsection (a) receives an initial medical examination from a
- 11 physician or other health care provider authorized under state law
- 12 to conduct medical examinations not later than the end of the third
- 13 business day after the date the child is removed from the child's
- 14 home, if the child:
- 15 (1) is removed as the result of sexual abuse, physical
- 16 abuse, or an obvious physical injury to the child; or
- 17 (2) has a known or suspected chronic medical
- 18 condition, [a] medically complex condition, or [a] diagnosed mental
- 19 illness.
- 20 (b-1) Only children described by Subsections (b)(1) and (2)
- 21 may receive an initial medical examination under Subsection (b).
- (i) Not later than December 31, 2022 [2019], the department
- 23 shall submit a report to the standing committees of the house of
- 24 representatives and the senate with primary jurisdiction over child

- 1 protective services and foster care evaluating the statewide
- 2 implementation of the medical examination required by this section.
- 3 The report must include for each region of the state:
- 4 (1) the level of compliance with the requirements of
- 5 this section; and
- 6 (2) the number of medical examinations conducted under
- 7 Subsection (b) and the reason for each medical examination [in each
- 8 region of the state].
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 264.1076(b-1), Family Code, as added by
- 10 this Act, applies only to a child who enters the conservatorship of
- 11 the Department of Family and Protective Services on or after the
- 12 effective date of this Act. A child who enters the conservatorship
- 13 of the Department of Family and Protective Services before the
- 14 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 15 date the child entered the conservatorship of the department, and
- 16 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
